MISSOURI MUSINGS

Trustworthy Spirit

Two months ago in The Voice I wrote about our trustworthy heavenly Father. Last month I wrote about the trustworthy Son. Now let us consider God's trustworthy Holy Spirit. He is present and at work in our midst. Here is evidence and a bit of explanation of that work.

Many of us were uplifted by a recent St. Mark event: the April 30th confirmation service. Why are confirmation services such an encouragement? There are several reasons.

1. The confirmands. These are young women and men who attended dozens of classes over the span of two years and wrote out their own testimony of faith in Christ. These students are our own sons and daughters. Their names deserve repeating here:

It was encouraging to be reminded of their dedication and see evidence of their desire and determination to follow Christ.

- 2. The congregation. The confirmation service took place at 2 PM on Sunday. Many who attended had already worshipped on Saturday evening or Sunday morning. Yet they returned on Sunday afternoon to celebrate the occasion and show support for the nine students above as they made this significant public statement of their faith. This show of love affirms St. Mark's character as a church that continues to care for its young people. Jesus' words, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 19:14), apply to teenagers too!
- 3. Holy communion. On April 30th we shared in the first communion of the nine confirmands. It is the work of the Holy Spirit by the word of God that saves us through faith, but the body and blood of Christ present in the communion elements confirm and nourish us. At the end of the communion service come those words which are my very favorite in the Lutheran liturgy: "The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in his grace." Those words remind and reinforce us in our conviction that God's promises are true, and our lives are secure in him despite the uncertainty, threats, and fears that are part of life in this post-pandemic world.
- 4. God's trustworthy Holy Spirit. None of the encouragements above would amount to much if they were based on human strength alone. But we have hope not because of ourselves but because of the Spirit who is one with the Father and the Son. God the Spirit looms large, being mentioned directly 247 times in the New Testament. Even in the Old Testament, we find "Spirit" 80 times.

God's Spirit is mightily at work from creation ("And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters" [Genesis 1:2]) to consummation ("The Spirit and the Bride say, 'Come" [Revelation 22:17].

Because of the Holy Spirit, we have hope in the areas listed above: the confirmands, the congregation, and holy communion. By the Spirit we are baptized and mystically made one: "For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body ... and all were made to drink of one Spirit" (1 Corinthians 12:13).

Because of the Holy Spirit our prayers are effective: "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words" (Romans 8:26).

Because of the Holy Spirit, followers of Christ have hope in a world that can seem hopeless: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope" (Romans 15:13).

That benediction is not shaky wistfulness but a divine promise! For Jesus said, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses ... to the end of the earth."

That Holy Spirit witness through the ages is why the church exists. It's why St. Mark exists. It's why nine confirmands confessed their faith in word and in holy communion on April 30th.

I close with words I shared with the confirmands at the confirmation service: "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope" (Jeremiah 29:11). Like all of Scripture, those words are given by ... the Holy Spirit!

By God's Holy Spirit, St. Mark members from newest to oldest can together take heart in his sure promise.

Council Highlights May 2023

Motion carried to name Debbie Plishka as Financial Secretary for the remainder of 2023.

Motion carried to name Rick Wilhelm as Maintenance Technician.

Motion carried to create a position for a full-time Director of Worship and Music.

Motion carried to set up "Positive Pay" with State Bank of the Lakes to reduce exposure to potential check fraud based on 2 instances which occurred during the month of April.

Motion carried to approve the purchase of three new air conditioning units to replace old units that require costly maintenance before they begin to fail.

Fin Facts

The Association of Related Churches states that the average church spends 50% of it's annual budget on personnel. Other research has found that the percentage spent on staff can range anywhere from 46% to 60% of a church's budget. Where does St. Mark fall, you may ask? Below are the actual percentages from Fiscal Year 2022 and what has been budgeted for 2023. Other research states that a church should have 1 full time employee for every 76 active members of a congregation. St. Mark has approximately 380 active members, which would mean we should have 5 full time staff. We currently have only two full time staff members, including our Intentional Interim Pastor!

Currently St. Mark has \$280,402 in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in a contingency account. St. Mark is on strong financial footing and able to invest in additional staff.

Some **SCIENCE** from your Church Doctor Task Force

Pam Burke recently got an email from Dr. Keith Nemec of the Total Health Institute out of Wheaton, IL. He had some very interesting thoughts and figures on volunteering.



Maybe volunteering at St. Mark could improve your health?

"Does the world pay back heroes for their selflessness? Or do "good people finish last?" Is there any reward in life for those who sacrifice for others? Does living out of love and concern for others have a physical, mental, or emotional reward?

Without God, life is "survival of the fittest" because without Him our only motivation is self<u>ish</u>ness. But research has thrown us a surprise: there is a reward for self<u>less</u>ness - in longevity. The altruistic tend to live longer! Something good happens inside when we give of ourselves, and that translates to better health and longer life.

The concept of sacrifice for the greater good is built into life. Complex life could not have developed otherwise, and for single cells to climb the ladder of complexity to become organisms, cells had to learn to work together and even give their lives for others at times. Each step up in complexity requires more selflessness for the sake of the organism, against the rule of survival of the fittest. For society to advance, the same has to happen: the societies that succeed ultimately do so because of the selflessness and concern for others of its members. We have designed into us special and counter-nature characteristics which can only be called by one name: love. When we respond to that design, we are benefitted physically and mentally, even when others don't appreciate or know about our actions.

Science confirms this. Researchers at the University of Michigan, as published in Health Psychology, took data from the Wisconsin Longitudinal Study that tracked a random group of 10,317 men and women aged an average of 69 years and questioned them at various stages of life as to whether they did any volunteer work, how regularly, and the motives behind their volunteering. The mortality rate for those who did no volunteer work was 4.3%. For those who did some volunteer work, the mortality rate dropped to 2.3%. Those who were doing volunteer work regularly had an average mortality rate of 1.8%. Then they considered the motives for volunteering, as some had self-centered reasons (wanted the social involvement, or to make friends with someone, etc.) but those who had altruistic motives had the lowest mortality rates in each grouping of volunteers, whether occasional or regular. The researchers' conclusion was that the desire to help others, to know they had purpose and value in life, and to make a positive difference improved longevity."






Our Families

Items We Do Not Accept

Mattresses or box springs, large appliances like stoves, refrigerators, microwaves, paints or chemicals, large mirrors without frames, large glass top tables, heavy desks, TVs, large exercise equipment, computers, large entertainment centers, encyclopedias, textbooks, magazines, Christmas trees, chandeliers, ceiling fans, wall to wall carpet, pool tables, ping pong tables, cribs, expired car seats, tires, building material, anything broken or with missing parts, sleeper sofas, pianos or organs, and aquariums. These items do not sell and are hard to get rid of after the sale. Please only donate clean, resalable items. If you would throw it out, so will we.

How You Can Help

When donating items put like items together. Kid's clothes in one bag, women's clothes in another, linens in another, housewares in one box, books in one box, tools in another, etc.. This greatly helps us when setting up. When you drop off items please leave them in the boxes or bags. Also please do not tightly tie bags closed. We reuse them to pack up after the sale, but if we cannot open them we have to rip them up and throw them away. Come help setting up the sale. We take help of all ages, but do ask that an adult stay with younger children. Confirmation students can earn service points. We have jobs for everyone! No special skills required. If you can open a box or bag, hang or fold clothes, or set items on tables you are qualified! Our help is getting older each year and we really would love to welcome some younger faces. Join us even if you only have an hour to give. Many new friendships are made at the sale. It is a great way to get involved and meet new people.

Work the sale. This involves straightening up after shoppers, helping shoppers with their items, answering questions, etc..



Praying in Unprecedented Times

"And the sons of Issachar, men who *understood the times* with knowledge of what Israel should do..." 1 Chronicles 12:32

Understanding the times (culture) is what we're about as Christians. There are unprecedented things that we have never experienced. As noted above, we are to know, how we ought to live and what to do in such a times as these.

Question? "How Then Shall We Live?" The answer is found in Philippians 2:15-16.



[&]quot;...in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation," (the culture),

"among whom you appear as lights in the world, holding fast the word of life," (your calling),

so that in the day of Christ I may have cause to glory..." (coming of Christ)

So how do we live this out each day? We live with character, integrity, purpose, calling, and hope. Christ is to be the center of our life, not the self. In this roiling, crazy time more than ever we need to understand that our need for security, being significant, and having satisfaction comes not from this world, but from God.

Living this out begins with prayer (Philippians 4: 6-7). When you are overcome with emotions, seek to train yourself to refocus and catch that emotional concern with your mind. Ask "Why am I anxious, why am I in despair, why am I despondent, why am I angry, or any of these things?" Think of your emotions as a diagnostic tool are telling you something's wrong. Ask yourself, "What is wrong with my thinking?" Then realize I'm allowing something that I shouldn't be is ruling my thoughts. So Paul writes "be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with Thanksgiving..." make request be made known to the Lord. So I turn the anxiety, fear, concern into a prayer and send it back to Him with a (hard) thanksgiving. So instead of taking it on and bear the weight that only God can bear, I give it to Him. Note, it (being anxious) will come back, but then I give it back and the more I give it back, I am training myself to where it (being anxious) stays up there more and more. Over time as you make this a habit, you find true peace which guards your heart and mind even while living in a world of fear.

Philippians 4:6-7 ⁶ Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Prayer Shawl Request

What a great feeling to find our once overrun supply of Prayer Shawls is just about depleted! So I am putting out a request for al to get busy knitting or crocheting.

Any color, any pattern, even just a simple knit/purl or chain stitch is acceptable.

This would be a great way to LEARN the simple stitches! Teach your kids... or grandkids. I have some yarn available if needed, but just about one 4 oz. skein will produce a shawl on size 10 needles with about 50-80 stitches; knit to at least 3 to 4 ft., or until the yarn is used up. Fancy or simple, fringed or



not....does not matter. However, whatever you do will be amazing! The only thing I ask is that the yarn used is soft, which makes the finished product cozy.

Please pray this prayer before beginning each session:

O God, who has included all commandments into one commandment of LOVE, we humbly pray that you will create in our heart such a sincere love of one another, that we may be children of our Father in heaven, and true disciples of Jesus Christ. Amen

And bless when finished with this prayer:

O Father of mercies and God of all comfort, our only hope in time of need, we humbly beseech you to behold, visit, and relieve the sick servant for whom this shawl is given. Look upon them in your mercy; comfort them with a sense of your goodness; and give them patience under their affliction. In your good time and using all wise means, restore them to health and enable them to lead their life to your glory. Grant that they may dwell finally with you in life everlasting, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
