For you see, in the end, it is between you and God. IT NEVER WAS BETWEEN YOU AND THEM ANYWAY.

Last year, we provided a little book to each family at St. Mark, titled I AM A CHURCH MEMBER. I confess that I was sad to see a copy of the book in the rummage sale donations. Why did that make me sad? Because the idea was to read the book from time to time to reinforce who God intends His church to be. MISSOURI MUSINGS

Trustworthy Prophets

Who is your favorite recent US president? Was it Ronald Reagan? Bill Clinton? Donald Trump? Joe Biden? Whatever your choice, that president was probably someone you felt you could trust.

Trust in public officials has declined in recent years, and the Bible may give us a clue why: "If a ruler listens to falsehood, all his officials will be wicked" (Proverbs 29:12). Presidents make decisions based in part on their advisors. If those advisors are simply "yes men," saying what they think the president wants to hear, their counsel will be corrupt. They will not speak truth: they will manipulate the truth to please the president. The result will be flawed decisions.

You are not a president, and neither am I, but we do make decisions - important decisions that determine the course of our lives. Where do we get our advice?

God has sent prophets to inform his people. Jesus looked at people through the lens that Isaiah provided: "Jesus said to them, 'Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written, *This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me*" (Mark 7:6). Ouch! But Jesus said what people needed to hear. He trusted the prophet Isaiah, because he knew that Isaiah spoke and wrote what God's Holy Spirit gave him to say.

In the Bible, the major prophets are Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Daniel. The minor prophets are Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zachariah, and Malachi.

These prophets (and many others) were not just serving up their own big ideas. Peter observes that none of what they wrote "was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit" (2 Peter 1:21).

The prophets do not tell us what we want to hear. Rather, they tell us what God thinks we need to know.

Most importantly, the prophets point us to Christ and the salvation he brings. "Concerning this salvation, the prophets who prophesied about the grace that was to be yours searched and inquired carefully, inquiring what person or time the Spirit of Christ in them was indicating when he predicted the sufferings of Christ and the subsequent glories" (1 Peter 1:10 –11).

We learn here the core of the message of the prophets. It was about grace. They were filled with "the Spirit of Christ." They pointed to Christ's suffering (the cross!) and "subsequent glories" like his resurrection, ascension, and victorious return, which we now await.

Seven times the New Testament speaks of "false prophets" (Matthew 7:15; 24:11, 24; Mark 13:22; Luke 6:26; 2 Peter 2:1; 1 John 4:1). The world is full of talk about religion and Jesus. Careful! There is a lot of misinformation. It is the biblical prophets we should trust.

Let me conclude with some news that will make many in Chicagoland very happy: the St. Louis Cardinals are having a horrible season! The Cubs are doing much better.

But early this spring, the sports pundits predicted that the Cards would run away with the Central Division. They were completely wrong! The Cards have been competing mainly for last place.

Be careful whom you believe about the future, especially the future of your life and soul. Don't be like a president listening to sycophantic advisors - men or women who flatter and say what you want to hear.

Study, learn, and take to heart the trustworthy prophets whose writings connect us with our saving Christ and God.

Council Highlights August 2023

A Council Retreat has been scheduled for Oct 13-14.

A motion passed to reclassify the bookkeeper position from part-time to full-time, effective September 1, 2023. The additional coverage will provide significant assistance to the Church Administrator by serving as cross-trained support and assuming some of those responsibilities as well as the responsibility of recording tithes and offerings and preparing year-end statements for donors.

The 2024 Budget was passed for presentation to the congregation during the Annual Meeting on November 12th.

A motion passed to use rummage sale proceeds to purchase utensils for the kitchen and two vacuums for use during and after annual rummage sales.

Preliminary discussion: Bylaw and Constitution verbiage change from "committee" to "ministry team" and "oversee" to "support" in reference to liaisons and their respective committees.

Since 2022 and continuing (hopefully!!) until FMSC is out of business, members (and their friends) of St. Mark will have an opportunity to feed hungry children around the world. I have reserved one table (19 people) once a month – either on a Thursday night or a Saturday morning. The schedule St. Mark will follow is:

Thursday, September 7th, at 6:45 to 8:45 pm (September's Sign Up)

And for those of you who like to plan ahead!!

Saturday, October 7th, at 8:45 to 10:45 am (October's Sign Up)

Thursday, November 2nd, at 6:45 to 8:45 pm (November's Sign Up)

Saturday, December 2nd, at 8:45 to 10:45 am (December's Sign Up)

Thursday, January 4th, 2024!!, at 6:45 to 8:45 pm (January's Sign Up)

We will keep this schedule up – odd numbered months Thursday nights, even numbered months Saturday mornings – so that people with different schedules can fit into either the night or morning sessions.

There are three different jobs at FMSC:

There is a sit down job putting labels on the bags we use to pack the food.

There is the job of actually packing the food.

There is a warehouse job for those of you who would like their exercise.

The reason to sign up before our scheduled time is to make sure the Libertyville site has enough room for us and, if we don't fill all 19 slots, we can give up some of our slots to others who might be able to help (but let's think we'll always fill our 19 slots!!). FYI, when you sign up, FMSC will ask for your email. They do NOT sell your email to any other company, but they will send you an email when the food you packed reaches its final destination with one of our 217 partners in 106 different countries!!

A Flourishing Life is a Choice Based in Prayer

St. Mark Church, is a House of Prayer "Devote yourselves to prayer with an alert mind and a thankful heart." *Colossians 4:2 NLT*

Praying for Life Choices and more...

As summer begins to fade into fall, the transition of the seasons is upon us. It is also the time of year when life choices past, present and those impending, manifest themselves. Over time our choices increasingly narrow as we make key life decisions - school choices, career choices, marriage choices, etc. aiming to make a "first class" life for ourselves. Teens struggle to know who am I; where did I come from; what's my purpose; what happens after I die? Adults too can continue to struggle with the same questions, especially when earlier choices fail to deliver the expected outcomes. Today's worldly culture is peddling life choices too - bad ideas, deceitful choices, misleading worldviews that are creating sufferers, victims and death rather than a "life that is full and good."

I wrote the above last September. How is your journey progressing? Did you seriously seek God's purpose for your life in the last 12 months through prayer, devotions, scripture as well as seeking mature Christians' thoughts? Did you listen for His call? Did you lay aside the world's wooing? If you heard His whisperings and chose the narrow path, you are on an extraordinary and unique journey. It will be full of indescribable adventures, challenges, sufferings, doubts, and joy for being who and for what God made you. And most precious of all you will find your relationship with Him growing deeper and deeper as the years roll along. Prayer is one of the essential disciplines for this journey to end well.

In the film *Chariots of Fire*, there is a significant scene when Eric Liddell¹ takes his sister Jennie for a walk in the hills of Scotland to explain his commitment to training for the 1924 Olympic Games in Paris. He tells her, "I've decided - I'm going back to China. The missionary service accepted me." Jennie rejoices to hear this, since she fears her brother's calling to be a missionary is being threatened by his interest in running.

However, Eric goes on to say, "But I've got a lot of running to do first. Jennie - Jennie, you've got to understand. I believe that God made me for a purpose - for China. But He also made me fast! And when I run, I feel His pleasure. To give it up would be to hold Him in contempt. You were right. It's not just fun. To win is to honor Him."

Liddell was a man of focus and passion because he pursued a growing sense of God's purpose for his life. "When I run, I feel His pleasure" - what do you do that makes you feel God's pleasure? Frederick Buechner put it this way in Wishful Thinking: A Theological ABC: "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." As you become a person of calling and purpose, you come to realize that God's good pleasure is also your good pleasure. Seek satisfaction apart from Him, and you will never find it; seek to please Him first, and you discover that satisfaction is a byproduct of the pursuit of God.²

Rummage Sale 2023 God is Good!



God is Good....All the Time....How many times have we repeated this phrase in church? More times than I can count, but this year it was never more true. This year it represents the biggest God sighting of my life. This year I can't just write a glowing thank you to all my wonderful very helpful fellow workers, I have to tell you how very Good God Really Is.

I have been helping to organize the rummage sale for about 30 years and those who know me know how much I enjoy this time each year. If you know me you also know February 27th I had a heart attack and I am very lucky to be alive. Everyone thought we would not be doing a sale this year but by God's grace, my family's care and all your prayers I healed quickly and was given the okay to do the sale with limitations. Here is where my God Sighting begins.

We started collecting donations, setting up the Ed Center and pre pricing items. I was on restricted hours so we were only working daytime hours, but

God sent such awesome volunteers...new and old...that each day we left with almost everything done. (God sighting #1. Me not working long hours.) We did have a very small group that came in a couple evenings to reorganize and get things ready for the next day. Setting up the main building started with a lot of brand new people helping us old timers move tables, chairs, boxes, bags and large furniture. Through all of this we were noticing how we had fewer donations than normal. (I don't think the ladies that hung about a million pieces of clothing would agree with this). But what I noticed was we had less donations but more volunteers. And what was great was many of these volunteers were new to the sale. (God sighting #2. New friends and fellowship). We did work all day now but I was watched over and helped by so many sometimes I felt like I could go take a nap and not be missed. (God sighting #3. Feeling God's love through others.)

The sale started and we all said it was one of the best ever. When we opened the doors the line was wrapped around the building. (Hint... don't ever ask Pastor to count people in a line, but it was a lot). All our shoppers were so happy to be at the sale and were so pleasant even when they had a long wait in line to check out. (God sighting #4. No stress or drama to deal with). We had plenty of workers during the sale and were able to keep up with cleanup and consolidating.

On Saturday when we put everything for free at 1:00 people seemed to come from everywhere and take away lots of great treasures. We had decided to close at 3:00 this year instead of 5:00 and when 3:00

came there was a lot less to clean up. Having less donations now didn't seem so bad. (God sighting #5. Quicker and easier clean up). Those vacuuming the Ed Center might argue this one. It did take a couple days after to haul away furniture, take down racks and put away supplies but that is normal. All this was made possible by the wonderful, awesome, hard working and faithful volunteers. Know I love and appreciate all of you more than you will ever know. You are truly my gift from God. (God sighting #6. Learning how important your church family is).

Church Council - Duties of the Officers <u>President (1 year term):</u>

The President presides over meetings of the Church Council and Congregation. The President is: 1) the chief administrative officer of the church and 2) an ex officio member of all Boards and Ministry Teams (committees).

Secretary (1 year term):

The Secretary keeps the minutes of the Church Council and of the Congregation. The Secretary publishes and posts them within 15 days of each meeting. The Secretary oversees the maintenance of the archives of the Congregation including annual reports of the Pastors, annual reports of the Congregation and minutes of the meetings of the Congregation and Church Council.

Treasurer (1 year term):

The Treasurer oversees and supports all financial planning, financial records and funds of the Congregation. The treasurer publishes and posts the monthly financial statements. The treasurer oversees the functions of the Financial Secretary (if any) and Bookkeeper and serves on the Board of Trustees.

Elder (3 year term):

The Board of Elders consists of three persons plus the President serving as *ex officio*. Elders encourage spiritual growth of the Congregation, conduct the Pastor's annual performance evaluation, oversee and support Ministry Teams (Worship /Music, Parish Education or Evangelism). Elders also support Outreach Ministries of the Church, seek out and encourage persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel and exercise church discipline as needed.

Trustee (3 year term):

The Board of Trustees consists of three persons and the Treasurer plus the President as *ex officio*. Trustees oversee the legal and corporate affairs, maintenance and administration of finances. Trustees oversee Ministry Teams (Property and Management, Stewardship or Congregational Life), review monthly Treasurer reports, appoint an annual auditing team and oversee benevolence activities and requests.



Growing In Christ Ken Boa: Conformed to His Image Fall Bible Study 2023

Facilitator - Barb Ewert Goal of this Study

The Scriptures speak of our lives as a pilgrimage - we're aliens and strangers in a land that is not our final home. Everyone's on a life journey. The wise will stop and consider who they are in God's eyes, where they've been, where they are, and where they are going. They'll also take into consideration the advice and maps of experienced travelers. True spiritual formation is Word-based so that it may result

in the complete equipping of those training in righteousness (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

"In spite of this prevailing tendency to conform (to the culture/world), we Christians have a mandate to be nonconformists. Almost heaven, West Virginia

We weren't quite in the Blue Ridge Mountains, nor did we see the Shenandoah River, but the mission trip was still AWESOME!!!! Ayla A, Amya A., Avina D., Abbey J., Logan J., Luke J., Ava K., Cheryl B., and I had a wonderful trip and would first like to thank you, St. Mark, for your prayers for the trip and your generous donations to make it happen!!

Our trip was to <u>Logan</u>, <u>West Virginia</u> – a small town of about 1500 people, tucked in the southwest corner of WV, and of those 1500 people, approximately 21% live below the poverty level. Despite this sobering fact, it was a beautiful area surrounded by big hills (I'm not sure I'd call them mountains) covered with trees, with lots of little creeks and <u>hollers</u> everywhere!





Our destination for the first day was Louisville, KY, and on the way, Twinkies were eaten and laughs were had! Once we got to Louisville – be careful how you say that name!! – we enjoyed a nice riverboat ride, ate some good food, and, for the people on the lucky side of the hotel we stayed at, enjoyed a nice fireworks display before we went to bed!! The next day. before getting to Logan, we made a slight detour to visit Asbury University, the home of last year's revival and to let Ava introduce us to her beautiful horse Odin!











Once on site in Logan, we were split into two groups – the Thundering Herd and the Mighty McCoy's. The Herd were sent to help the kids at the Big Ugly Community Center – yup, you read that right – the "Big Ugly"!! It is named after a river that runs through the holler but in my eyes, it wasn't very big nor was it ugly, but that's what they called it!! At this center, kids from nursery school age to high schoolers, came to hang out and have fun, get a free lunch, and have summer "school". (As a former teacher, I'm not sure how much schooling was going on.) This center also had a free clothes giveaway room and had plans to start up a food pantry for the area. Our kids loved on the nursery school kids right away and at the end of the week, they had to <u>literally</u> pull some these youngens off of our kids!!

The Mighty McCoy's on the other hand, got a little more dirty than the Herd did – actually – a LOT MORE DIRTY!!! Their first 2 days were spent at a local school emptying and painting 3 rooms, cleaning desks and other furniture, and cleaning and organizing the recess room. Their 3rd day was spent at Chief Logan State Park where they hauled away logs (old telephone poles) from an unsafe bridge. And on their last day, they visited an assisted living home where they sang songs and performed a "skit" (please ask the kids about this "skit"!!). They next went to a warehouse to separate clothing that would be dispersed to 10 elementary schools and then *finally* finished their day by assisting residents at a clothing closet where all items are free.

Gathering" each night, we (and this is good for ALL of us) were reminded that we are here to Love, to Share, to Unite, and to Go into this world to spread the Good Word! PADS HOMELESS SHELTER MINISTRY 2023/2024



St. Mark will once again be a Pads site for the upcoming October thru April season. For those of you who don't know Pads is a county wide program that helps to house the homeless at different churches each night of the week. St. Mark is open on Friday nights. We will need many hands to run the site from 5pm on Friday night to around 7am on Saturday morning. Ways to help.....

Set up...usually about 5:00pm-6:00pm...make up the sleeping pads, set up tables and chairs, bring out supplies and if needed get kitchen set up. Perfect for scout troops.

1st shift...5:00pm-11:00pm...heat up food, serve dinner, clean up kitchen, pass out supplies as needed and visit with guests.

2nd shift...11:00pm-3:00am...easy shift...guests are sleeping....bring a book to read or grab a friend to visit with, if needed make bag lunches for next day.

3rd shift...3:00am-7am...wake guests, make breakfast and serve, clean up kitchen and pass out lunches.

Clean up...5:00am-7:00....gather laundry, wipe down pads, clean bathrooms, put all supplies away and whatever else is needed.

Food donations....we need people to make or donate food for dinner, breakfast and lunches. Doesn't have to be homemade. Order pizzas or chicken, grab a dessert from Jewel or buy supplies for lunches.

St. Mark has been a Pads site for about 30 years. We need lots of help to continue this much needed ministry. More info in coming weeks. Did you know?

As of July 31st St. Mark had \$303,450 in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in a contingency account and \$337,986 in Restricted Funds. Due to staff vacancies, the church is running a net income (gain) through July in the amount of \$69,473.

Fin Facts

Instead of the anticipated loss of (\$40,136) in the budget for the end of July, the church has a significant gain of \$69,473 through the first seven months of the fiscal year.

At the 2022 Annual Meeting the Congregation stepped out in faith and approved an anticipated loss of \$35,850 for this fiscal year. In spite of income coming in on a monthly average \$5,000 below budget, God has provided. The proposed 2024 budget will be published soon. Once again we will be asking for approval of a loss in 2024. Our church is financially sound and God will provide as he always does.

We Need More Ushers!

Hello all. For the past few months, with the combined 9:00 service, we have been utilizing ushers from both the 8:00 and 10:30 services and things have been going quite smoothly. In September, however, we will return to the two Sunday services, and this would be a good opportunity to recruit additional usher team members.

The usher duties are essentially as follows:

- Arrive about fifteen minutes before the service to hand out bulletins or other items to worshippers as they arrive.
- During the service, take a headcount of all present, both adults and children, including all in the nursery (this can be done by one or two of the ushers).
- Collect the offering and attendance sheets after the sermon.
- On communion Sundays, guide the worshippers up for communion.
- After the service, at least two ushers will be needed to sort out the offerings and attendance sheets and place in designated places.
- Lastly, after the service, do a quick check of the pews to pick up any bulletins, candy wrappers, or other items, and make sure no one left anything.

For the team to function smoothly, we need four people per service. This is where we could use the additional help. We currently have, for most services, two people signed up to help. We have the teams set up so that each team is assigned the same Sunday each month (i.e., 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th). There are generally four 5-Sunday months a year and for those, we usually get volunteers from the four other teams.

We would really appreciate your consideration to help with this important part of the service. If your schedule is such that you can't commit to being on a regular team, you can also sign up to be a substitute. All help is greatly appreciated.
