# MISSOURI MUSINGS

### **Strange Times**

One of the striking aspects of life at present is the passing of time. On the one hand, the weeks seem to be flying by. Has it really been over two months since quarantines began?

On the other hand, it seems like late winter and early spring have lasted forever. As I write this (May 12), it is 51 and starting to rain. Many years it's in the 80s by this time and the tomatoes are planted. This year we seem stuck in March. The days drag on monotonously, and the only thing sprouting in the garden is late winter weeds. Oh, and a few sickly squash volunteers from last year's crop.

So these are strange times, somehow both racing by and dragging on simultaneously. We need wisdom to make sense of it.

God comes to our rescue with the infinite wisdom of His word about human times. I'll point to just seven helpful nuggets:

- 1. Ps 9:9 "The LORD is a stronghold for the oppressed, a stronghold in times of trouble." God offers protection in times of testing and need.
- 2. Ps 31:15 "My times are in your hand." With this confession to God, David acknowledges that every day, hour, and second pass under God's oversight. Since he is all powerful and all good, those who trust in him live in long-term hope even when there is short-term uncertainty.
- 3. Ps 34:1 "I will bless the LORD at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth." There is always something to be thankful for, something God is giving us that we don't deserve, something that God is protecting us from that we don't even realize.
- 4. Ps 119:164 "Seven times a day I praise you for your righteous rules." How many times do we pray each day? Maybe once with our Bible reading, once before each meal (if we don't forget), and maybe brief moments of mental prayer in between. Scholars think that David set aside seven prayer times daily. No wonder he could say, "My times are in your hand" (see 2. above). David committed his affairs to God in prayer about every two hours he was awake.
- 5. Acts 1:7 "(Jesus) said to them, 'It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority." Jesus said this to the apostles just before he ascended into heaven. The apostles did not understand all that they wished about their times, even with Jesus as their teacher. How much more must we be content to live in faith and sure hope in what the Father is doing?
- 6. Acts 17:30 "The times of ignorance God overlooked, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent." Paul preached these words to the Athenians. He called on them to repent and believe in Christ. Some did. Then and now, the times are favorable for the spread of the gospel message.
- 7. 2 Cor 9:8 "And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work." We may feel stressed, inadequate, and pawns of medical, economic, and political forces we cannot control, yet God's grace is at work at all times. We can honor him in decisions and actions great and small.

Scripture speaks, finally, of "times of refreshing" (Acts 3:20). We inhabit such times, reminded of God's fresh promises with the arrival (however slow) of spring. This holds true whether our days seem to drag, or whether they race by to destinations known only to our heavenly Father.

I was thinking about Moses the other day and how he clearly heard God's directives from the burning bush, but he was afraid to proceed because he didn't feel competent. He kept giving God excuses until God finally said, okay, okay, your brother Aaron will go with you to Pharaoh. Despite Moses' insecurities, God still worked through him because God's plans will always be accomplished.

As of this writing, the latest news reports state 365,000 deaths around the world, over 100,000 in the United States alone, from this single virus that we never even heard of until some 6 months ago.

How many, we wonder, died without knowing Jesus as their Savior because no one shared Him with them? Let's not be silenced by the enemy who is holding us back with his deception that somehow we're not equipped as Moses felt. On our own we probably aren't but we aren't on our own, which Moses finally learned. We have the same power in us that rose Jesus from the dead!

Now is the time. The church building doesn't need to be open for us to be the Church. Let's not let people die without sharing our joy when God sets us up for encounters with others, with friends, family, neighbors, strangers.

God, please help us get out of Your way as You work through us. Amen!

#### The Internet is a new way of receiving God's message

A friend, Dr. Glenn Sunshine, History Professor at Central Connecticut State University and a religious scholar stated, "I'm not happy about not being able to meet live for church, but consider: in England, ten times the number of people that were attending churches on Sunday are joining online services. A church in my town that has under 200 people attending on a typical Sunday is getting 6,000 people on Facebook Live. A multi-campus megachurch in Florida that gets 10,000 people for live services on an average Sunday and 18,000 on a typical Easter got 60,000 people viewing their service online this Easter." We have found that we can continue to worship despite being in quarantine.

#### This is a time to grow your faith

In difficult times like these and the COVID-19 virus, when you may question your faith, it is a time when you may grow closer to Jesus. During trials and temptations, we find solace in James 1:2-4, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything." God is with you 24/7 and at work during this pandemic and he is working in the hearts of all people.

So, as we move forward, let us praise God for all that he has done to keep us safe. It may be difficult to see God's work, but he is working for the good of those who love and cherish him.


