Why so Much Hate?

During the years when Pastor William Shields and I were visiting Sudan twice a year to preach and teach (about 2007–12), we met a Sudanese pastor who planted churches and led several small congregations. He was born into a Muslim household, but as a young adult he professed faith in Christ. Eventually he became a pastor.

We are still in touch with this man. He is still shepherding several small congregations in an overwhelmingly Muslim region. Recently his church gave aid to a widow and her six children. Now this woman and her children have moved from Islam to faith in Christ. Glorious!

But the pastor there marks the danger they face. Things have improved of late in Sudan, but they are still tough for Christians. The pastor writes: "I am happy to tell you that the Sudanese government has allowed us to share and express our faith freely. Hallelujah! However, radical Muslims are very angry, so there is tension in the air, and I saw such hatred of Christian people, and it is a hatred I couldn't really understand."

I shared this news with a pastor in the US. He wrote: I think we're seeing that same kind of hate in the eyes of the radicals who are protesting in our cities. And I can't understand it either."

So why the hate? At one level it can be puzzling indeed.

But at another, it's not really a mystery if we know the Bible. As soon as sin entered the world (Genesis 3), what happens? Cain kills Abel (Genesis 4). Murderous hatred has a very long history.

But surely people have evolved since then! No, that's not what Scripture says. Psalm 14 reminds us: "The LORD looks down from heaven on the children of man, to see if there are any who understand, who seek after God. They have all turned aside; together they have become corrupt; there is none who does good, not even one."

These words are repeated in Romans 3. They echo Jesus' view of his own followers: they are evil at heart (Luke 11:13). The problem, Jesus says, is the human heart: "For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness" (Mark 7:21–22).

Hearts like that—my heart and yours—are perfect havens for hatred.

The Bible often uses the word "flesh" to describe the heart and its tendency. It speaks of "the works of the flesh"—what our hearts produce in practical terms. Hateful acts are among them: "sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these" (Galatians 5:19–21).

The good news is that God can change the heart. Jesus said, "Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water" (John 7:38). Torrents of hate are replaced by "rivers of living water"! These are character traits like love, joy, and peace, and acts of mercy and compassion that build others up rather than despise and assault them.

To keep you better informed about Church Council decisions we briefly present the major items from our September 8th, 2020 meeting.

A presentation was made to purchase eight security cameras to cover the entrances as well as the church courtyard. The Council will receive a presentation on how the cameras will work, the area they will cover, etc., at the next meeting.

Under Old Business the Council reviewed the CARES ACT Small Business Loan to the church, learned about the candidates for the Council election, discussed the annual congregational meeting, and reviewed reopening the church's facilities to outside groups involved in ministries.

The Council approved the confirmands for the Reformation Sunday Confirmation service. (Listed on Page 11)

The meeting will begin at 9:15a. The purpose of the meeting is to:

- elect officers
- approve By-Law changes
- approve annual budget

What is the Safety and Security Committee?

In December 2019, the Safety and Security Committee was formed to assess and enhance the safe environment of our church. The committee is led by Al Maciareillo. The other members are Sarah Maciareillo, Mike Mol, Judy Dunfrund, and Deb Zuchowski.

To date, we have evaluated our properties with an eye toward safety. We have worked diligently with the Church Council and Worship and Music Committee to help re-open the church for on-site services following careful COVID19 state guidelines. We have a variety of other things we are looking at, including a security system for the church and working directly with Lindenhurst Police and the Lake Villa Fire Department to make sure that we are doing all we can in the event of an emergency. We have also updated our AED units and First Aid kits in both buildings.

We are looking forward to offering CPR classes and having basic emergency training sessions for all congregants in the event of fire, severe weather, or active shooters and we will review and advise on any concerns of safety or security within our church.

This is a time when so many things are changing and we want to make sure St Mark is a place of peace, comfort, and serenity to worship our Lord.

So how should Christians regard the hatred they see all around? God's word tells us "to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people" (Titus 3:1–2).

How different would social media be if people were like that?

You may ask: Why should we cut slack for other people when they are so . . . terrible? Here's why: "For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, slaves to various passions and pleasures, passing our days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating one another" (Titus 3:3).

If we are different from that description, it's not due to our goodness. It's rather because something wonderful and unmerited happened to us:

when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life (Titus 3:4–7).

We see the face of hatred in many places today, near and far, and we shudder. Let's make sure our response reflects a changed heart.

The main purpose of the book is to show how God uses suffering to prepare us for eternity – for life forever in our heavenly Father's house. Neither is it a theodicy, the writer discussing the age-old dilemma of how a good God can allow evil and suffering (also known as "the problem of

2020/2021 Season Update

St. Mark has been part of the PADS program welcoming homeless guests into our church on Friday nights for over 25 years. This season like everything else this year will be

different. The PADS guests will not be housed at different churches each night. Since April they have been put up in hotels and will continue to be in hotels through April 2021. This is safer for the guests and the volunteers. This means we will not need volunteers or food at St. Mark on Fridays this year. If you are interested in helping you can go to their website https://www.padslakecounty.org

or call 847-689-4357.

They are always looking for nonperishable food items, hygiene supplies, gift cards to Walmart or McD's and of course monetary donations. Please check before you bring items to make sure what is needed at that time. Please keep the PADS program in your prayers as they navigate this new normal. They are still looking for a permanent site where everyone can be housed at one place. If you know of any large empty spaces that would allow them to use their spacepreferably with showers, let the PADS office know.

Feed My Starving Children is open for business.

FMSC Libertyville is welcoming volunteers "Back to Pack" in a safe yet fun environment.

While we had to close our doors to volunteers for a few months due to COVID-19, the need for food around the world has not slowed down, and we need your help more than ever!

We continue to offer packing sessions during the weekdays and evenings, and starting in September, we are opening up sessions on Saturdays as well!

You can see available volunteer opportunities and sign up on www.FMSC.org/volunteer. Be sure to read the new safety protocols below before committing to volunteer, and don't hesitate to reach out with any questions about our new policies and procedures.

New safety protocols in effect:

All volunteer groups must register on-line before attending, no walk-ins will be allowed to pack.

You can come by yourself or with a group of up to 5. If you sign up as a group note that you will not be socially distanced within your group but will be socially distanced from others.

Everyone in your group must be at least 8 years old.

All volunteers will need to verbally complete a health questionnaire when arriving at the site, be required to wear a face mask and have your temperature checked.

We have also implemented a number of other safety protocols that will be explained when you enter our packing site. We want to be up front that the packing experience is going to be very different from what you have experienced in the past. Please understand that all of these new procedures are for the safety of our volunteers, our staff, and everyone who comes into contact with FMSC meals.

Please remember that all our food is paid for through donations from volunteers just like you! We ask all volunteers to consider donating in order to pay it forward and continue to feed more kids. Each meal that is packed cost only \$.24, and \$88 is all it takes to provide a meal-a-day to a child for an entire year!

We are excited to partner with you as we pack food for the children who so desperately need it now more than ever!


