Thoughts from the Council President

Psalm 14 starts out with a terrifying truth, that "The fool says in his heart, God does not exist." Although it isn't terrifying for us as God's children, it is certainly terrifying to us on behalf of those who do not believe in God's existence and consequently are not saved. As I read this Psalm on Valentine's Day, February 14th, it's a reminder that the love Jesus commands us to have for one another should cause us not to cast off the unbeliever as hopeless but to reach out to that soul and allow the Holy Spirit to work through us as we love on them and keep praying for the veil of blindness to be removed. The work of the enemy placed that veil over those eyes and we are commanded to continually pray for those we know need Jesus to come to know the Truth. Command is a pretty strong word that implies obedience and obedience is part of it but when we allow the love of God to flow through us, obedience becomes a strong desire to share the promises of God and hope that we have in Him. We look around us in the world today and wonder how God will ever penetrate the hearts of some people who are behaving in monstrous ways, but that part isn't ours to know. We just need to share what we have, not try to change a heart. Only the Holy Spirit can do that. Consider how joyful the day will be when we see the power of the Holy Spirit alive in someone we once saw lost and now found. The Bible gives us several examples of how heaven rejoices when one sinner is saved in the parables of the Prodigal Son, the lost sheep and the lost coin. And to be used for that purpose? Wow, what a privilege.

What Would We Do Without Friends?

Jim, an old friend of mine (whose wedding I performed back in the late 1970s, come to think of it) sent me this message first thing today:

"When God put a calling on your life He already factored in your stupidity."

Most comforting thing I've ever heard.

That made me laugh. It was a great way to start the day. We all do and say stupid things. Sometimes we beat ourselves up over it. Let's hope we improve over the years. But Christ died for all that is worst in us, including the "You dummy!" parts. Let's confess to God (1 John 1:9), receive forgiveness, and move on!

And so my friend Jim reached out to me the way good friends do.

Friends are important for all kinds of reasons. They fill a basic human need: family is important, but so are close contacts outside our family. A good Christian friend will pray for us. By being friends with people, we open up connections to share Christ with them. Being a friend to others, caring for them, maybe even sacrificing for their sake--these things make us better people.

In friendship as in other areas of life, Jesus' saying holds true: "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35). There is both a giving and a receiving to friendship that enriches us immeasurably and may even save lives--whether ours or our friend's.

For some people give up on their lives, maybe because they have no friend. There's another reason to be alert to those around us who may need someone to be friend them.

Friendship is rooted in how God made us, how he relates to us, and how we, created in his image, can relate to each other. God befriends those who trust in him. Scripture says that God spoke "to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend" (Exodus 33:11). Abraham is called "a friend of God" (James 2:23). Jesus called his disciples friends (John 15:14–15).

He also hinted how he would express his friendship: "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). Call that the ultimate test of friendship. Jesus Christ did it for each of us.

A favorite St. Mark hymn is "What a Friend We Have in Jesus," and that's true. But there's another hymn that's worth singing on this topic: "I've Found a Friend." One verse goes like this:

I've found a friend, O such a friend! So kind and true and tender, So wise a counselor and guide, So mighty a defender! From Him who loves me now so well What pow'r my soul can sever? Shall life or death or earth or hell? No, I am his forever.

Now that's a friend, and a friendship worth pursing every day we are on this earth until we see in person the One whom we have thus far known only by faith. As Jesus told Thomas, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed" (John 20:29).

But we don't stop with celebrating Jesus' friendship.

We do what my friend Jim did for me today when he sent me that message: he thought of someone besides himself, reached out to me, and I'll bet prayed for me when he did (maybe that I would be cured of my stupid--a prayer I need: thanks, Jim!).

Now, how can I be the friend to Jim and to others today that Jim has been to me . . .

MONTHLY BENEVOLENCE HIGHLIGHT

Feed My Starving Children and Open Arms Mission

With the generosity of the St Mark community, we are able to tithe as a church and support a number of worthy charitable organizations. We do this every year, but we decided it would be a good idea

to inform the congregation about the organizations we support by highlighting one each month. Since we started late, we will actually highlight two organizations this month. *Feed My Starving Children* and *Open Arms Mission*.

Open Arms Mission

Open Arms Mission is a local food bank located on Highway 83 south of Antioch. There is a great need to supply food for the hungry in Lake County especially during these hard times. We give them 10% of our allocated benevolence budget which amounts to approximately \$7000 per year. We were also able to give them an extra \$2000 of unallocated money at the end of 2020. In addition to this we also have monthly food drives at the church to help fill their pantries. Thank you to both the members of St. Mark for your generosity, and Open Arms for the great service they provide for the needy in the county.

Feed My Starving Children

Feed My Starving Children is an international organization that packages food staples to send to starving people in third world countries. The nearest facility is located in Libertyville. They rely on volunteers to come and package the food for delivery. As a church we have sent a number of groups at different times to volunteer. Our youth have been especially active with this project. We allocate 5% of our benevolence budget, or

approximately \$3500 a year, to this

wonderful cause.





During that time, the committee has struggled with how to encourage our members to use online giving. Well, the good news is that our members have increased the use of online giving by many-fold. The bad news is the Pandemic drove that unintentional improvement.

So why is online giving beneficial?

First off you do not have to fill out those envelopes and carry them or mail them to church.

There is a cost savings when the church does not have to print and mail those envelopes.

There will be no more offering checks to write.

Regular and consistent giving helps our church with budgeting. It evens out the annual giving, especially if you are on vacation or are a "Snow-Bird". Your offering always comes even when you are gone. You can even schedule special offerings long before the date.

Online giving has all the giving categories including, not limited to, Debt Retirement, Flowers, Holiday giving and special offerings such as Memorials, to name a few.

It helps the counting teams (a volunteer committee) with less checks to count and tabulate.

It assists our Financial Secretary, Patrice, in tabulating giving reports since all information is provided electronically.


