Ready for What's Out There?

In times of crisis, people will sometimes start going to church. Or they will seek God, or reach out for spiritual direction, in some other way.

A recent BBC posting (https://www.bbc.com/news/world-us-canada-55419894) observes that COVID has led people around the world, of all faiths and of no faith, to seek spiritual meaning. The article states:

Just as the anxieties of 2020 have led many to search for greater meaning in their lives, the pandemic has made it easier for people to explore their spirituality, with the move to online religious worship.

If people seek God and find him because of COVID, great!

But a better approach may be to seek God *before* there is crisis. Be ready in advance. Jesus talked about this with the story of the wise man and the foolish man (Matthew 7). They both built houses. But then a storm came. Only one house survived.

The wise man built his house knowing that storms eventually come. Life may be trouble-free today. But everyone faces crisis eventually. Why not prepare for it?

Last night around 8 PM we (the two dogs and I) were on the day's last loop, a half-mile circuit through some pretty wild woods. Up by the old burned down barn, Josie (on her leash) veered off sniffing into the northeast wind. Something was out there in the dark. I dutifully followed the little 40 pound mixed-breed that we are dog-sitting for a year for my son and daughter-in-law. Maybe she smelled a mole and would get rid of it. They tear up the field and our yard.

Dagger (our 100-pound German shepherd) oddly hung back on the main path. Whatever was out there, he wasn't crazy about encountering it.

Josie stopped and stared into the darkness, nostrils flaring. In the distance a siren began to wail on the highway a mile away. I braced for Josie and Wolf to erupt in howling--they always do with sirens. They did.

At the same instant, just a long stone's throw into the woods, so did a number of coyotes. The next 10 seconds was ear-splitting din, my two dogs versus a hungry pack. I wasn't cold, but the eerie squalling gave me chills.

I am confident that if Josie had been off the leash, she would have made a yapping beeline for the coyotes, and they would have welcomed her cruelly. Dagger might have survived due to his native caution. Or maybe his size and imposing bark would have dispersed the coyotes. But probably they would have outnumbered him, and it would have been his last attack.

Here's my point. I have learned that there are things "out there" that it's good to avoid. Josie has a brave fighting spirit, but she is alive because of a leash. It keeps her attached to her source of real protection--me.

For all of us, things lie ahead that are bigger than we are. When times are good, people like to do as they please. But when things go south, we realize how fragile life can be. God is predictable, permanent, and protective. Our lives are exposed to all sorts of hazards that we cannot foresee or control. Who is holding the leash of our lives?

The Bible doesn't talk about leashes for dogs, but how about this: "Do not be like the horse or the mule, which have no understanding but must be controlled by bit and bridle or they will not come to you" (Psalm 32:9).

God offers us Jesus Christ, his Holy Spirit, the written word of God, and other means to guide and protect us by faith. The very next verse of Psalm 32 says, "The LORD'S unfailing love surrounds the one who trusts in him." Now that's protection!

Through the ages, God's people have learned that what may feel like a leash (or bit, or bridle) is actually a lifeline, connecting us to a God who can sustain us whatever circumstances may throw at us.

How can we avoid the trap of going our own way . . . and then realizing we're a little dog surrounded by coyotes? Here's some wise counsel: "Pursue righteousness, faith, love, and peace, along with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart" (2 Timothy 2:22).

Reflections One's Prayer Life

"Prayer at its best is the expression of the total life," writes A.W. Tozer. Have you been growing in your fellowship with the Father during these stressful times? Are you listening to the Father during your prayer time allowing him to nurture your relationship? Have you ever thought about reflecting on your prayer life?

"All things being equal, our prayers are as only as powerful as our lives. How does one assess our life in Christ? Do we start with prayer? Put another way, are my prayers filled with emergency prayers or

much prayer throughout the day? Do we examine our priorities of seeking first the kingdom of God? This honest assessment will take some time alone and may require some input from a spiritual mentor or two." ¹

This short paragraph is Chapter One's first question for the reader from the *Reflect and Apply* section at the end of **Growing in Christ** group's next book selection, *Prayer, Communing with God in Everything – Collected Insights from A.W. 

Unfolding Destinies: The Untold Story of Peter Fleming and the Auca Mission By: Olive Fleming Liefeld

This month's book selection, *Unfolding Destinies: The Untold Story of Peter Fleming and the Auca Mission* was written by a former member of our church. Olive Fleming Liefeld, widow of the missionary Peter Fleming, relates her


version of the events already familiar to readers of Elisabeth Elliot's "Through the Gates of Splendor". Olive describes details of the fateful trip in 1956 during which Pete, Jim Elliot, and three others were killed by Waorani Indians in Ecuador.

In 1989, Olive returned to Ecuador and met the Indians who were responsible for her husband's death. There she discovered previously unknown pieces of the puzzle and gained new insight into the events themselves. She came away with a deeper understanding of the ways God works in the lives and destinies of His people. You can find this book in the St. Mark Authors' section of the library.

For so many years the committee has struggled with how to encourage our members to use online giving. Well, the good news is that our members have increased the use of online giving by many-fold. Thank you for those who are participating in online giving.

During the past year we have found a "new normal". Far from anything like normal, we go grocery shopping online and they are delivered to the door. We are ordering meals to be delivered and do I need to mention the endless variety of products delivered to your doorstep from Amazon?

So why not try online giving. Here's why online giving is beneficial:

- First off you do not have to fill out those envelopes and carry them or mail them to church.
- There is a cost savings when the church does not have to print and mail those envelopes.
- There will be no more offering checks to write.
- Regular and consistent giving helps our church with budgeting. It evens out the annual giving, especially if you are on vacation or are a "Snow-Bird;" your offering always comes even when you are gone. You can even schedule special offerings long before the date.

- It helps the counting teams (a volunteer committee) with less checks to count and tabulate.
- It assists our Financial Secretary, Patrice, in tabulating giving reports since all information is provided electronically.






