President's Notes

I just returned home from attending the ALICE presentation given by our own Al Maciareillo. Al, Sarah, and their two daughters have been members of St Mark for a number of years. Both Al and Sarah are employed in law enforcement and the last couple of years we have richly benefited from Al's leadership as Chair of our Safety & Security Committee.

Al is on the Riverwoods police force and is certified to teach multiple courses, one being ALICE. ALICE stands for Alert Lockdown Inform Counter Evacuate. This method has replaced the former standard of lockdown alone as the primary tool to prevent lost lives due to violent activity across the nation, particularly that of active shooters. After this single hour, I have a significantly greater awareness of how to respond to a potential threat. Prior to the training, I'd have used the word react instead of respond and I have no doubt those who attended would say the same.

This training was open to all members on May 1 & May 15 but only a handful took advantage of the opportunity, perhaps because we have a lot of other things to do on Saturday mornings. I see Al's time as a gift to the congregation and only after listening for the short hour is one aware of the difference it makes to one's level of awareness. I don't only want to encourage everyone to attend this presentation, I would like to make it available between services on a Sunday morning while we still have ample time in the absence of our fellowship hour (*temporary absence!*). It won't be mandatory, you won't see shocking, disturbing videos of gunfire, but you will find yourself walking into stores and restaurants with a much greater awareness of your surroundings.

MISSOURI MUSINGS

Traction

In a college class we were assigned a sermon to read by the New England pastor Jonathan Edwards (1703–1758). It was called "Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God." Preached in 1741, the sermon is still worth reading today. It was based on the words of Deuteronomy 32:35 (KJV): "Their foot shall slide in due time."

Pastor Edwards paints a moving and frightening picture of people sliding into judgment. It's a frightening thought. How can we keep moving upward and closer to God in our life of faith in Christ? How can we keep our foot from slipping?

You could say it's a question of traction. "Traction" is the grip that a tire has on a road surface. Here in Missouri, we live on a steep ridge. Every direction is down a steep hill. Our vehicles are all wheel drive because otherwise we wouldn't have enough traction to get up our gravel road. My John Deere 3038e tractor has chains on all four tires. Otherwise, in mud or snow it wouldn't get traction.

Without traction, you may not be able to avoid sliding down. And you sure won't have enough tire grip to climb a steep grade when there's snow or mud.

Jonathan Edwards observed that in the Bible God's people often slipped away from God. They often disobeyed his laws and went their own way. God withheld judgment for months, and years, and even decades and centuries. But at a time of God's choosing, he let them fall into the pit they had dug by disobeying their God.

Their foot slid or slipped. They lost traction.

One of Jesus' half-brothers, Jude, has great advice about keeping traction:

²⁰ But you, dear friends, by building yourselves up in your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit, ²¹ keep yourselves in God's love as you wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to bring you to eternal life. ²² Be merciful to those who doubt; ²³ save others by snatching them from the fire . . . (Jude 20–23 NIV).

In these words we see what traction looks like. First, "keep yourselves in God's love as you wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to bring you to eternal life." Pastor Breum often mentions death and dying. He urges us to trust in Christ and grow in Christ so our hope in him trends stronger as we age and grow closer to meeting God face to face. When we live in a state of readiness to meet the LORD God our feet are not slipping. We have traction.

Jude also mentions "building yourselves up in your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit." Growing in faith and prayer are like tire chains: if we are moving toward the LORD we will not slide back into spiritual lethargy or flat-out sin.

Jude also says, "Be merciful to those who doubt; save others by snatching them from the fire." This is outreach. This is sharing Christ. This is evangelizing. If we are sharing Christ with others, showing them mercy, and doing the hard work of "snatching" others "from the fire," we will not be sliding and slipping ourselves. We will be holding on to God and Scripture in prayer, worship, and service.

Under severe conditions, my John Deere tractor will break traction. A wheel will spin. Stop right there. There is a special pedal. Push it: it locks all four wheels. Traction is regained. The tractor crawls out of the tough spot.

Jude's teaching is like that tractor pedal. God put it there for us so our foot won't slip.





St. Mark Council News

To keep you better informed about Church Council decisions we briefly present the major items from our May 11, 2021 meeting. Should you desire in-depth information, please go to https://smlc.info/minutes/ for additional Council and Committee minutes.

Important decisions from the May Council meeting:

The Council was pleased to welcome Tom Mathisen and Taylor Schultz, Camp Timber-Lee Executive Director and Public Relations Manager to the May Council meeting. Tom and Taylor attended the meeting to express their sincere appreciation to St. Mark for our long relationship and continued support. Jane Milani, also present on behalf of Parish Ed, presented Tom and Taylor with a check representing partial payment scholarships from St. Mark's Endowment Fund to support 4 of our youth who will be attending camp this summer. One of the 4 youth also earned sufficient points for her additional funding! These kids are going to have a great time this summer as they experience the summer's theme of "Great Expectations" and focus on 1 Peter 1:3. The goal for the year is to instill hope into the campers.

A motion to formally accept Emily Leeds' resignation was accepted unanimously although very reluctantly. We will all miss Emily and Geoff tremendously. God blessed us with Emily's talents for a short time and we are thankful. God is good all the time and all the time, God is good. We know He has good plans for Emily and Geoff and for St. Mark.

Council discussed the potential for easing the COVID related practices St Mark has been following with the "bridge phase" beginning in Illinois on May 14, 2021. The South doors will now be open for entry and exit. The North doors will remain "exit only" to ensure current sign-in procedures remain manageable. Two communion tables, one at each end of the narthex, will accommodate the flow of those exiting through each of the doors. The offering drop-box is now located below the bulletin board, outside the mailroom. Additional practices we've been following since last summer will be reviewed during the June Council meeting in anticipation of IL entering Phase 5 and future recommendations of both the IL and Lake County Health Departments. Please continue to wear masks inside the building and practice social distancing as many in our congregation have not yet been fully vaccinated.

The next Council meetings are scheduled for June 8 and July 13, 2021 at 7:00PM.

I refer to this as a gift because each of us is being used by God in one way or another at St. Mark and God is using Al to teach us something God wants us to know. Jesus warned us of the evil to come as we approach the end times and this violence that we're seeing in today's news is only the beginning. This training is not designed to scare anyone, and it doesn't, it just makes us aware of our surroundings and how to respond if we ever have to.

Secondly, we have finally reached the Bridge phase of Covid restrictions and are so very thankful that the potential to reach Phase 5 is within reach. We have been following the recommendations of the CDC, IL Dept. of Health and the Lake County Health Dept. all along and we will continue to do so. We will also remain cognizant of the fact that although each of us is responsible for our own health and what we need to do to protect ourselves, we are the Body of Christ, here to protect and encourage each other and not to put others in harm's way. We will ease up on the processes we have in place as soon as we can to get life back to normal but if we need to continue a process for a little longer than what might seem necessary, please understand that there's a good reason for the delay. We're all in different places with this return to normal process and it might be even more challenging to get back to normal than it was when changes were implemented last year. But... we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope (Romans 5:3-4) and we sure do have hope that this is over soon! Stay tuned for more updates after the Council meeting on June 8th and until then, please share your thoughts with me or with a Council member so we can thoughtfully consider them while making decisions.




Starting June 6th | C3 Student Ministry






Clothing Donation Bin

St. Mark now has a clothing donation bin located in the back parking lot of the Education Center. Acceptable donations are as follows. All clothes and shoes in any condition (Holes and torn items are fine.). Towels, sheets, comforters, curtains, small rugs, just about any kind of textiles in any condition as they recycle what cannot be reused. Small toys, pots and pans, and other small kitchen items. NO electronics or larger kitchen items like microwaves, toaster ovens, etc. will be accepted. Also, NO baby items like car seats, cribs, etc. will be accepted. Please do not leave items outside the bin.
