Discovering Peace

One of the pains of the pandemic was restriction. We were not allowed to move about freely. Travel was curtailed. Public gatherings (like church) were canceled.

I was reminded how restless we are. People long for freedom to move, act, express themselves, connect with others, and at times be alone.

Now that COVID restrictions are being reduced, we are enjoying more freedom. Last week I traveled to Minneapolis to teach a five-day course on 1 Timothy. In the airport I bought a book to pass the time. The title was *Whatever It Took*. It was the memoirs of a World War II paratrooper.

I thought of some of our St. Mark veterans, like the late Ed Bybee (WW II) and John Hemauer (Viet Nam).

The book *Whatever It Took* recounts the memories of a 95-year-old named Henry Langrehr. He was born in 1924 and grew up in Clinton, Iowa. His German-descent parents were Catholic and Lutheran, but neither attended church. Henry was never even baptized. When he jumped out of the plane at the Normandy invasion in June 1944, he was an atheist.

Yet on an opening page of the book we read: "I am with you always, even unto the end of the world" (Matthew 28:20).

Why would an atheist quote Jesus?

Well, two things happened during the war that God used to change Henry's heart. One was the time two fellow soldiers died in his arms from battlefield wounds. Both died reciting what Henry later realized was the Bible.

You find this on page 124 of the book. "John" died with the Lord's Prayer on his lips. "Bill" was saying Psalm 23 as his life ebbed away.

What stuck with young Henry was the look of peace on their faces. No desperation. No struggle or terror. Henry was amazed. He knew if he were dying, he would lack that peace.

The other thing that moved Henry toward God was the faith of his fiancée, Arlene. She had promised to wait for him till after the war, and she did. Henry went missing in action. There was no word for months. Finally, Arlene learned that he was a POW. During all that time, her faith that he would return never wavered.

He did return. Henry became convinced that there was something to Arlene's prayers and faith. She had that same peace and steadfastness that he had seen in his buddies who died. He writes, "I started taking lessons with Arlene's Lutheran pastor. He baptized and confirmed me. I became a Lutheran and a firm believer in God" (p. 199).

The book is vague about details, but we know what that Lutheran pastor must have shared if Henry truly found God: the good news of Jesus Christ, who died for our sins and rose from the grave so that all who believe in him might have eternal life.

Not long ago, Pastor Breum shared devotions on the fruit of the Spirit. The second fruit is "peace." We all seek it. "Never satisfied are the eyes of man," Scripture says (Proverbs 27:20 ESV). In 1968 the Moody Blues sang, "We're all looking for someone." How true! In 1987 Bono and U-2 sang, "I still haven't found what I'm looking for." There's probably a song that is popular right now that says the same thing.

Post-pandemic, we crave freedom to be out and about. We're so thankful to talk to each other without masks! But in our outward movement, we seek inward peace. Henry the paratrooper found it through faith in Jesus Christ. Henry and his faithful wife Arlene remind us of Jesus' promise: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you" (John 14:27).



St. Mark Council News

To keep you better informed about Church Council decisions we briefly present the major items from our meeting. Should you desire in-depth information, please go to https://smlc.info/minutes/ for additional Council and Committee minutes.

Next Council Meeting: Wednesday, August 11th, 2021 6:15-6:45 pm (one time change)

As we more comfortably return to in-person worship, we've removed the ropes separating the pews with the exception of the far-right sections on the main floor and balcony. Those pews will remain reserved for those who are more comfortable wearing masks and sitting apart from those who do not wear masks. We will continue to provide space to ensure the comfort of all worshipping.

The *nursery will re-open on August 22nd* for children to be cared for during worship services by our amazing Deb Heide, Nursery Coordinator, and her team of volunteers. Since children under the age of 2 are not required to wear masks but unvaccinated children over the age of 2 should wear masks, the two nursery rooms will be designated accordingly with each age group, under 2 and over 2, assigned to each of the two rooms. All toys and surfaces will have been sanitized, carpets will have been cleaned and caregivers will wear masks during nursery hours in the spirit of encouragement.

Sunday school will be in-person and teachers and coordinators will follow the same Covid mitigation protocols as the schools. At this time, children over the age of 2 through age 12 and those unvaccinated over the age of 12 will need to wear masks as will teachers in the spirit of encouragement.

Communion will continue to be served with the pre-packaged elements for a while longer while the safety of servers handling the wafers and bread is still questionable. Partaking at the altar will be revisited in the fall. Pastor's provision of several moments of reflection following the Words of Institution brings a meaningful time of meditation with God during this significant part of worship.

Starting in September, worship bulletins will be prepared for the 5:30 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. services, and the screens will continue to be used at all 3 services. We will provide both bulletins and screens to ensure we meet the needs of those who watch computer screens all week long and need a reprieve and those who enjoy the screens. Printed announcements will not be inserted into the bulletins but will be made available on the table near the offering boxes underneath the bulletin board in the narthex for those who like to take them home as reminders of upcoming dates events.

Three time-sensitive matters were discussed and unanimously approved during a Council meeting via Zoom on 6/16/21, prior to the July 13th Council meeting. The 3 approved motions were documented during the July Council meeting:

- We accepted a proposal for a diagnostic church consultation and follow-up from Church Doctor Ministries at a cost of \$12,500 plus mileage and hotel travel expenses.
- We opened the church buildings for use by groups and members as was allowed pre-COVID with reliance on the hosts of each event to comply with all remaining active COVID mitigation protocols.
- A disbursement of 10% of 2020 Rummage Sale funds were donated to the Antioch Traveling Closet.

Soon, on August 9-11, many of you will have the opportunity to share details of your thoughts, opinions and ideas in person with Tracee Swank and Kent Hunter of Church Doctor. Thank you in advance to all who will participate. These interviews will be so significantly valuable to Church Doctor's work in formulating recommendations for us as to what we can do to be the church God intended for us to be when he prompted those guys back in 1956. There is just so much more we should be doing as a church and we need help in determining what those things are and how to do them. Remembering ACTS: Praising God During Challenging Times

What is the first action you take, when life confronts you with difficulties, hardships, and challenges? Deal with it yourself? Consult with trusted friends, experts, pastors, doctors... If their solutions fail, seek God's 911 line, prayer.

Why do you think our auto-response follows the above pattern? One who has a Christian mindset will usually follow the acronym ACTS and will reflect a more

balanced prayer – <u>Adoration</u>, <u>Confession</u>, <u>Thanksgiving</u>, and <u>Supplication</u>. (Not included is a closing prayer of thanksgiving.) It is also reflecting the model established in the Lord's prayer.

When making a supplication, the Christian mind is focused on an eternal perspective with the goal that one's prayer is geared to meld with God's will. The Christian trusts that God's answer is the one that will be a blessing from the eternal perspective even though from the temporal perspective it does not appear to be anything like a blessing. This response is born of training and practice reflecting a habit that develops over time, usually 40 days. But, as with all good habits, it must be practiced daily. Bad habits need no practice and they just bubble up. So to help you to practice ACTS, here is a scripture to assist you with *Adoration*. *Next, pause to express your thoughts of praise and worship*.

"Great and Great and marvelous are your deeds,

Lord God Almighty.

Just and true are your ways,

King of the nations. [a]

4 Who will not fear you, Lord,
and bring glory to your name?

For you alone are holy.

All nations will come
and worship before you,

and worship before you, for your righteous acts have been revealed. Revelation 15:3-4 LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

You have set your glory in the heavens. Psalm 8:1

How great are your works, LORD, how profound your thoughts!

Fellowship Hour Servers Needed!




We ALL love the donuts and coffee between services! There are openings for servers available for one Sunday each month. (The commitment is for one Sunday a month.)

Celebrate Recovery

Hurts, Habits, and Hang-ups! Many of us struggle with them, some more than others. It's part of growing up in a fallen world, and since none of us had perfect parents, chances are we carry some kind of hurt, habit, or hang-up with us during parts of our life. I was raised in an Irish, Catholic, Alcoholic home, so by the time I reached early adulthood I had serious substance abuse issues as well as an identity that was primarily shame based. Celebrate Recovery[®] I did not believe I was worthy of God's love.


Some of us are able to shake off our hurts, habits, and hang-ups and lead productive, fulfilling lives. The rest of us choose to deal with these issues in less than productive ways. We struggle with alcohol and drug addiction, co-dependency, anger, depression, gambling, sexual purity, compulsive spending, pornography, eating disorders, food addiction, relationship difficulties, trust, forgiveness, and resentments. We use these dysfunctional behaviors to hide from the inner turmoil and pain that can overwhelm our daily lives. In 2007, when my destructive choices finally brought me to my knees, God led me to a program called Celebrate Recovery. That's where my journey to healing began.

Celebrate Recovery (CR) uses a biblical variation of the traditional 12 steps developed by Alcoholics Anonymous, but instead of using God "as you understand Him," it specifically uses Jesus Christ as a "higher power"! For me personally, that made all the difference in the world. In addition, there are eight principles of recovery based on the eight beatitudes found in the book of Matthew. CR is much more than another program for alcohol dependency. It reaches out to people with all kinds of compulsive, dysfunctional behaviors as described above. I found sobriety through AA, but I addressed my deeper issues and discovered my true identity in Christ through CR. As a result, I no longer operate from a shame-based identity. I know who I am in Christ!

Interested? There are anonymous CR meetings in several Lake County locations. Google can help you find one. I attend CR at the Chapel in Grayslake. We are sponsoring a Celebrate Recovery Event called "UNCHAINED" on Saturday, August 7th from noon to 5PM. There will be worship, information tables, guest speakers, opportunities for prayer, and even a free lunch! If you struggle with any of the issues listed above, think about attending. It just may be the start of your healing journey!


