As I write this, I'm thrilled with the anticipation of learning who God has in mind for the remaining position on our 2022 Council. From the Desk of Pastor Breum

Matthew 19:14 (NLT2) ¹⁴ But Jesus said, "Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to those who are like these children." Your children are precious in the sight of God and deserve to hear about the love of Jesus and eternal life week after week. Unless you are teaching them at home (and yes, I know some do), they will hear the Good News no where else.

God is so gracious and merciful and abounding in steadfast love. I want us to be the same for each other. That is what I am trying to communicate. Kindness goes a long way these days to lift people up and don't we all need that?

MISSOURI MUSINGS

9/11 & God's Visitation

We recently marked 20 years since the beautiful late summer day when airliners were hijacked and thousands lost their lives. What lessons can we take from where we are now?

- (1) How swiftly time passes! One New York City fireman who survived the day observed, "It feels like 50 years ago, and then it feels like yesterday." Our days on this earth, which often seem to drag on forever, are in the end fleeting. "What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes" (James 4:14).
- (2) Our lives are deeply impacted by what we devote ourselves to. One New York Port Authority Police officer was the handler of a yellow lab named Sirius. The dog checked vehicles for explosives in the basement of the South Tower. When the officer felt the ground shake at the impact of the first plane high above, he told Sirius, "Listen, you stay here. I'll come back and get you once we do the rescue." But the building shortly collapsed. The officer escaped, but Sirius, waiting faithfully, was crushed to death.

In the following months the officer tried to comfort himself by saying, "Well, the people were more important than the dog, obviously." But he eventually realized that until he accepted and truly grieved the loss of his faithful dog, he would never be able move past 9/11 in his life. Part of being human is to know deep attachments to things like animals, places, and human enterprises like our work or sports. Scripture acknowledges that we are people who desire "to love life and see good days" (1 Peter 3:10). It gives directions for pursuing these things without shortchanging God.

(3) In times of deep human need, people become freshly aware of God. I remember that in the days after 9/11, there were community worship services at St. Mark and elsewhere. People felt anew that we are "one nation under God." The awful loss of life made people who normally ignore or disparage God turn to him in fear, craving security and hope.

On the day of the disaster, one of the two sole survivors from under the destroyed World Trade Center lay trapped in the smoking debris. He knew he was dying. But in his daze he had a vision or dream--"a person walking toward me, a glowing white robe . . . In the distance is a pond with trees, real tranquil." He was jolted awake. He prayed to God and thanked him for his wife, for his daughter, for his US citizenship, as he had immigrated from Colombia. He determined to fight for his life. Many hours later after night had fallen, he heard voices in the distance: "United States Marine Corps, can anybody hear us?" Miraculously, he was rescued.

Disaster visited our nation on 9/11, but it was also an occasion for "visitation" by God. In the Bible a "visit" from God can be for good:

Genesis 50:24 ESV And Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die, but God will <u>visit</u> you and bring you up out of this land to the land that he swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob."

But it can also be synonymous with destruction:

Isa 10:3 ASV And what will ye do in the day of visitation, and in the desolation which shall come from far?

Jesus rebuked Jerusalem because it rejected God's visitation in the form of Jesus' presence:

Luke 19:44 ESV And they will not leave one stone upon another in you, because you did not know the time of your visitation."

Let us pray and live for God's favorable visitation, aware that he is present at all times with his people, covering us with his guidance, protection, and favor.

Even in those 9/11 hours.



St. Mark Council News

To keep you better informed about Church Council decisions we briefly present the major items from our meeting. Should you desire in-depth information, please go to https://smlc.info/minutes/ for additional Council and Committee minutes.

The Council listened to those of you who recently shared your thoughts and as a result, for additional mitigation during the uptick in the spread of the Delta variant, every other pew in the sanctuary is available for seating rather than every pew in efforts to enhance social distancing during worship. The far-right sections of the sanctuary main floor and balcony remain reserved for those who are masked and prefer sitting apart from those without masks. (Mask-wearers are not required to sit in this designated section).

During the Sunday School hour, entry to the Ed Center requires masks due to the ineligibility of children under the age of 12 to be vaccinated and the unavailability of live-streaming for Sunday School. All Sunday School classes are housed in the Ed Center (approximately 70 children at this time).

The proposed 2022 budget was approved for the Annual Meeting to be held November 14. Thank you to the Finance Committee, Lynn Wetterberg, Pam Preston and Jill Winling and Treasurer Jim O'Neal, for the many hours they invested with the committees and staff to finalize a plan.

Is God tapping you to use the talents He's blessed you with for a 1 year term as Council Treasurer?

Prayer Changes People and Things

Did you ever think about or wonder how God interacts with our prayers? A.W. Tozer in his book, <u>Prayer, Communing with God in Everything – Collected Insights</u>, provides the following thoughts. First, he reminds us man is of more value than anything else. God created man in His own image and He created things to serve man. His primary concern is with intelligent, moral beings, not with lifeless matter. But each of us has a material body and have to live ours days in an environment of matter, time and space. Things are important to us. Our earthly life is entwined with

matter and laws that control matter. Today, we find ourselves in ever changing circumstances beyond our control that threaten our spiritual wellbeing and physical welfare.

"At such times it is altogether proper that 'we' should pray to God to alter those circumstances and 'change things' to afford a more favorable climate for the growth of the Spirit. A thousand promises are recorded in Scriptures to encourage 'us' to ask and seek and knock to that end so that unfavorable things might be changed or removed altogether." History of Israel and the church abundantly reflect that God does hear and answer prayer.

Tozer points out in all of our praying, that we keep in mind God will not alter His eternal purpose at the word of man. One does not pray in order to persuade God to change His mind. We cannot pray for God to suspend His will for us or for whom we pray. God will always be himself.

God's love desires the best for each of us and he longs to give us the best at any cost. Think upon water from the rock, the parting of the sea, quieting the wind, an angel opening a prison door and more. All these things and a thousand others He has done and will do in answer to prayers, but only because it had been His will to do it from the beginning. No one persuades Him.

The apostle Paul commands under the power of the Holy Spirit to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess.5:17) and to 'devote yourselves to prayer " (Col. 4:2). As we pray in the spirit *over time* we will begin to see people and things from a heavenly perspective. Thus habitually praying in the Spirit will change us, the people in our sphere of influence, and things (for He made things to serve man.") "What the praying man does is to bring His will into line with the will of God so God can do what He has all along been willing to do. Thus prayer changes the man and enables God to change things in answer to man's prayer." ²

So how did you do on last month's 6 questions put out there by your Safety & Security Committee? Do you think you batted better than 500? Or did you not bat well enough to get out of the minor leagues? Here are the answers. Be an honest grader!!

How many emergency exits are there in the sanctuary?

There are 5 emergency exits out of the sanctuary. As you sit looking at the altar, three of the exits are "behind" you and they lead out into the narthex and then out the north or south exit doors or through the old library. And two are in "front" of you, one near the organ and one near where the Christmas tree is placed during the Holidays.

Where are the AEDs located in the Church Building and the Ed Center?

The AED in the church is on the wall opposite our church administrator Debbie's office and the one in the Ed Center is in the upstairs' main room to the right of the elevator door.

How do you open the emergency exit window in the basement of the Ed Center?

(You may want to read the next question and answer first and then come back to this one!). It has two small "latches" at the top of its frame that need to be rotated before you can pull the window back and out. Once you have the window out of the way you can use the ladder in the window well to exit up and out of the building.



- There actually IS an emergency exit window in the basement of the Ed Center? For those of you who don't get down to the basement of the Ed Center often (or have never been downstairs) – yes there is an emergency exit window in the classroom nearest the bathrooms. There is a sign in the ceiling labeling which room the emergency exit window is in. In case you don't know, it is the "Pre-K and Kindergarten" room. The window is directly in front of you as you enter the room.
- Besides helping to put out a fire, what is another good use of a fire extinguisher?

Sort of a trick question here but if you have ever been to an ALICE Training you might know what we were looking for here. (As a committee we would love to have you all see an ALICE presentation at church and we will be in discussion with your Church Council about this soon.)



The answer we were looking for was, in case of an intruder in the church or Ed Center, you could use it to distract the intruder by setting it off, throwing it at him/her, or (as a very last resort) using it as a weapon by hitting the intruder with it.

Where are the fire extinguishers in the Fellowship Hall? In the Sanctuary? The Narthex? The Fellowship Hall: As you walk into the Fellowship Hall - as if you were leaving service and, on your way, to get a cup of coffee and a doughnut - there is a fire extinguisher to your


immediate right in the corner. (We will talk about the kitchen area and fire safety in next month's VOICE.)


The Sanctuary: There are two fire extinguishers on the main floor - one each near the exit doors in the "front" of the sanctuary. There are two more near the top of the stairs on each side of the balcony and one more in the classroom that has access to the furnace/AC room.

The Narthex: There is one fire extinguisher near the exit doors on the north end, outside Pastor's office.

So 5 out of 6? 2 out of 6? Umm, I was never a good test taker? Whatever you scored, we as a committee hope you are now more aware of safety items in and around our church's facilities. Please be on the lookout for next month's questions and more updates from your Safety and Security Committee. How St. Mark Missions Giving Touches the World Bob Yarbrough

Thanks to St. Mark's (and God's) benevolence, Pastor Bill Shields and I were, over many years, able to help churches in Sudan provide (1) theological training and (2) hunger and medical relief for Christians who were impoverished and discriminated against by the Muslim majority.

We also provided sight to the blind! We carried corneas from the Illinois Eye Bank in Styrofoam coolers. A doctor from Wheaton would meet us there and performed dozens of cornea transplants. He also trained Sudanese doctors to perform the procedure.

We were able to help sponsor the conference expenses of Christian workers who by themselves could not afford to travel for a day or more, take part in a five or six day seminar, and then travel home.

More recently God opened doors for Pastor Bill and me to teach in Cape Town and Johannesburg, South Africa. We have visited there ten times. In just a few weeks, Pastor Bill and I will attend a conference there virtually. We will each give three or four talks. We hope to be there in person next year, once COVID concerns are less acute.

There is not enough space to detail here how the lives of thousands are being touched by the gospel of Jesus Christ for the glory of God through the faithful giving of St. Mark. But perhaps these lines give a general idea.


