

Major Truths from a Minor Prophet

I have found much encouragement reading the minor prophets. I am much more familiar with the major prophets. The difference between major and minor prophets is one of size. The major prophets wrote more. Here are some verses that shouted out to me.

Habakkuk 1:2-4 (NLT2) ²How long, O LORD, must I call for help? But you do not listen! "Violence is everywhere!" I cry, but you do not come to save. ³ Must I forever see these evil deeds? Why must I watch all this misery? Wherever I look, I see destruction and violence. I am surrounded by people who love to argue and fight. ⁴The law has become paralyzed, and there is no justice in the courts. The wicked far outnumber the righteous, so that justice has become perverted.

Habakkuk lived 600 years before Jesus was born. What he wrote could have been written yesterday with all that is happening locally and worldwide. I encourage you to read the entire book. It is only 3 short chapters. Today, things are not worse than ever. There are no new sins under the sun. Sinful human behavior does not improve over the ages. It is a constant current that will not be stopped until the Lord Jesus comes again. God answers Habakkuk's question directly. In the answer we discover that God sees all that is happening and will actively bring correction to the sins of the day. God sets things up to occur, so people are humbled and repent.

Habakkuk 2:4 (NLT2) 4"Look at the proud! They trust in themselves, and their lives are crooked. But the righteous will live by faith." There are nuggets of gold through the Bible. We go treasure hunting every time we open the Bible, and this is one of them. "The righteous will live by faith." This one short phrase changed the life of Luther and sparked the reformation in Germany. Yes, there is evil all around us. God's salvation is even greater than all the darkness we see. God saves us, rescues us from this mess by giving to us "faith", the ability to believe in Jesus Christ. And in that faith is the righteousness of Jesus Christ that makes us right with God and heaven bound. The gift of faith and the righteousness of Christ are given to us by God's grace. The phrase in Habakkuk is further explained by Paul in Romans and elsewhere. Luther felt like he entered the gates of paradise when he finally understood "the righteous will live by faith."

Friends, our answer to today's catastrophes is to live by faith, a continual belief and trust in Christ that outshines the darkness and sin of our day. **Habakkuk 2:14 (NIV)** ¹⁴For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea. The glory of the Lord has shined and will continue to shine and one day the entire earth will be covered by it. Evil loses and goodness wins. Sin is stopped in its tracks and righteousness reigns supreme. Please see the full picture and don't get discouraged by only seeing the present darkness.

Habakkuk 2:20 (NIV) "²⁰But the LORD is in his holy temple; let all the earth be silent before him." Friends, if we were to lay eyes on Father, Son, and Holy Spirit ruling the universe from the Throne Room of God, our complaints would be silenced. We would be completely overwhelmed by God's holiness. Nothing is escaping God. His works are perfect. We may not see what God is doing, but that is what living by faith is all about. Faith is that inner assurance, certainty, and confidence that God is who he says he is. "Faith cometh by hearing and the hearing of the word of Christ." We can be silent before God and read his word. God is speaking clearly. Are we listening?

Habakkuk 3:18-19 (NIV) "¹⁸yet I will rejoice in the LORD; I will be joyful in God my Savior. ¹⁹The Sovereign LORD is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer; he enables me to go on the heights." After listening to God, Habakkuk ends on a high note some may call ecstatic. I call it encouraged to the max. Habakkuk has become my favorite minor prophet. To see the problems and still to be able to rejoice in the Lord and enjoy new heights of faith in God is true godly maturity.

Dear Heavenly Father, thank you for giving to us the righteousness of Jesus Christ. Thank you for creating faith in Jesus inside of our souls by your grace. May we cling to Jesus, rely on Jesus, and trust in Jesus far more than ever. In these dark days, help us to rejoice in the Lord and experience new heights that are ours through Jesus. This we pray in the name of Jesus. Amen.

MISSOURI MUSINGS

Surprise Pumpkins

And he said, "The kingdom of God is as if a man should scatter seed on the ground. He sleeps and rises night and day, and the seed sprouts and grows; he knows not how (Mark 4:26–27).

These words of Jesus remind us that God's work in the world defies our understanding. Sometimes we try to be faithful, but we don't see the fruit of our labor. We pray and don't get an answer. We share the gospel with someone but to no avail. Recently Pastor Breum wrote in a devotional that he asked a group of teenagers if he could pray for them. Their reply was no.

But Jesus' words reassure us. He describes a farmer planting seeds. After planting, the farmer goes about his life. As for the seed, it "sprouts and grows; he knows not how." As the Bible says elsewhere, it is "only God who gives the growth" (1 Corinthians 3:7).

Over the summer I saw a dramatic example of seed growing and the gardener not knowing how. I was the gardener. In late April I planted three hills of cucumbers and four hills of squash. Once everything sprouted, a plant came up on its own--a volunteer. It looked like a squash, or maybe a cantaloupe, and it was more robust than the other plants. Maybe it was even a watermelon! I let it grow.

We had some good rains and the garden took off. Before I knew it, that volunteer plant had taken over everything else. We only had a few cucumbers. Under the thick foliage of the rogue watermelon (I thought), I could see a few squash here and there. But I spent my time working on the tomatoes and peppers. I kind of gave up on the squash side of the garden.

But late in the summer the "watermelon" started to turn orange. The rogue plant was a pumpkin! I didn't even plant a pumpkin. But then we remembered that last fall Bernie made a pie from a pumpkin. She put the seeds in the compost bin. Over the winter I dumped the bin in the garden. Evidently, in the spring, one of those seeds sprouted. That single plant dominated a 14' x 30' section of the garden.

What was truly amazing was the yield. In early September when I picked the pumpkins, I was expecting maybe a dozen. The thick leaves were hiding over 50 pumpkins!

As for the squash, which I thought had been crowded out, there were about two dozen acorn squash and an amazing 45 butternut squash! I had to use a construction wheelbarrow to cart everything to the house. Twice.

Here is my point. God gave growth to the pumpkins (and much else) which I didn't even plant. And that's how it is in God's kingdom. He gives much growth and blessing in matters that we don't pray about or even know about. The richness of his grace is far greater than our ability to direct or micromanage it.



This does not mean that we should not seek God's blessing. It does mean that we should thank God that he is "is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think" (Ephesians 3:20). If he can produce a rich harvest when the gardener didn't even know what was growing, he can surely save souls, preserve his church, heal a nation, and bless the whole world.

No wonder Jesus also said, "Have faith in God" (Mark 11:22).

Our Action Plan Task Force is in place to start our Movement for Improvement journey! Thank you, Pam Burke, Jerry Gass, Kristi Knull, Mike Mol, and Pam Preston for serving on this team! After this group reviews all the recommendations we received from our ChurchDoctor consultants, Kent Hunter and Tracee Swank, they'll determine who, committees, groups or individuals, is best suited to develop action plans for each recommendation. That's not to say that standing committees or groups will be required to develop the action plans because this process is intended to engage the entire congregation. Even if you only love the idea of a recommendation but don't have any expertise in it, if you have any interest in it, your thoughts and opinions will be welcome as brainstorming sessions begin. Please let a Council member know if you have ideas!

We are still in need of a Treasurer on the 2022 Church Council. We have never been in the position of not having a Treasurer because the one God taps on the shoulder has responded in the past so this is unfamiliar territory. No nominations are allowed during the Annual Meeting according to our Bylaws but God has a plan for us. Are you part of this plan He has for us? Please



Putting Prayer in God's Perspective When is prayer at it's best?

A.W. Tozer writes, "Prayer at its best is the expression of the total life." What does that look like when we make our choices throughout the day? Does my choice glorify God or myself? Does my choice show love to my family? To my neighbor? Does my choice reflect a living sacrifice as a worship to God (Romans 12: 1-2) or do I crawl off His altar? Do you pray about these choices at the beginning of the day and thank God in the evening for His grace to be His servant and friend?

Thanksgiving Tozer shares the insight, "A spiritual journey awaits us as God reshapes our petitions, molds us more into the image of His Son, and brings closure to the matter prayed about in such a way that

His holiness, His mercy, His love, and His glory are ever magnified."

Christians who are seeking "a more satisfying prayer life, one that elevates and purifies every act of body and mind and integrates the entire personality into a single spiritual unit" will find it is only the result of a life lived in the Spirit. Tozer writes, "To pray effectively it is required of us that there be no unblessed areas in our lives, nor parts of the mind or soul that are not inhabited by the Spirit, no impure desires allowed to live within us, no disparity between our prayers and our conduct." Too high of a standard? Is God not the Lord of the impossible? Through the cross of Christ God has made provision for His children to be delivered from the yoke of sin. (Romans 6:11) There is no doubt the redemption in Christ "has sufficient moral power to enable us to live in a state of purity and love where our whole life will be a prayer."

Such prayers which raise out of this kind of total living will have about them a wondrous power not known to the careless or the worldly Christian.⁵

So one way to start is practicing **A lifestyle of gratitude** to get our eyes off of ourselves and onto God. This practice is one-way God can turn the difficulties of life into a redemptive tool by developing a sense of gratitude for God's goodness of life and His tender mercies. Here are four categories to start with: (1) the glory of God's creation; (2) material blessings; (3) relational blessings (people in your life); and (4) spiritual blessings. Thank God for each of these things daily.⁶


