# **Fallow Ground and the Rain of Righteousness**

It was almost 60 years ago, but I remember it well. On June 13, 1963, my grandparents embarked on a 6,000 mile road trip in their Pontiac Catalina with two bickering grandsons, Jim (age 12) and Bob (that was me—age 9 at the time).

The goal was to visit relatives. My grandparents had Canadian roots. We visited kin in St. Paul, Minnesota; Winnipeg and Brandon, Manitoba; Saskatoon and Swift Current, Saskatchewan; Walla Walla, Washington; and Portland, Oregon.

We visited my mother's birthplace, a tiny prairie homestead amid wheat fields and caragana hedges near Conquest, Saskatchewan. My grandfather and his older brother Wes were discussing farms and farming. They pointed at fields where nothing was growing. They said, "That's summer fallow."

I took their word for it. But what was "summer fallow," I wondered? "Fallow" basically means unused or undeveloped. In the Great Plains of the US and Canada, there is not enough moisture to grow wheat every year. So they allow fields to lie idle every other year. This rests the soil and allows moisture to build. After an idle year, the fields grow more abundant crops.

"Fallow" can describe the human heart. Our hearts should be productive. We should bear the fruit that God's word plants in us. James urges, "Receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls" (James 1:21). God's word can take root and grow, changing our lives and bringing him honor through our devotion and service.

But our hearts may underperform. Twice the Bible speaks of "fallow" hearts. The great (and some think greatest) prophet Jeremiah wrote, "For thus says the LORD to the men of Judah and Jerusalem: 'Break up your **fallow** ground, and sow not among thorns'" (4:3). That means let God's word penetrate your hard hearts. Quit devoting yourself to barren pursuits. Turn to the LORD!

Jeremiah preached and wrote ca. 600 BC. Much earlier, in the eighth century BC, Hosea also likened the hearts of God's people to fallow ground (Hosea 10:12): "Sow for yourselves righteousness; reap steadfast love; break up your **fallow** ground, for it is the time to seek the LORD, that he may come and rain righteousness upon you."

Hosea saw that before God's righteousness can *reign*, he must "*rain* righteousness upon" us. But fallow hearts are hard hearts. Even if rain falls, it can run off without sinking in. So he says, "Break up your **fallow** ground, for it is the time to seek the LORD, that he may come."

This is a word for our time too. Jesus spoke of dark days when "because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold" (Matthew 24:12). We see lawlessness on every hand, sometimes including our own. It is tempting to grow callous—hard-hearted. Why not? Everyone else is!

But as Hosea put it, if we "sow ... righteousness," we will "reap steadfast love." Our righteousness comes from the steadfast love of Christ who died, rose, and reigns. He makes our hearts fertile, not fallow, as the rain of his gospel falls.

But what difference does it make? You are just a single person. One person can't do that much. Really?

Tell that to the dozens of kids and teachers who are alive today because of Jacob Albarado. He was getting a haircut one morning back in May in Uvalde, Texas. His cell phone pinged. His wife, a teacher, texted: There's an active shooter in the hallway! Robb Elementary School was just a few blocks from the barbershop.

James Alvarado borrowed a shotgun from the barber. (Thank goodness the barber was equipped to exercise his right of self-defense.) He ran to the nearby school. He stood guard while locked-down classrooms crammed with children escaped the shooter.

Eventually, putting his own life on the line, he used the force required to restore order. Jacob Albarado's heart was not fallow but courageous. He was zealous for his wife and many innocent children, one of whom was his own daughter.

In these distressing times, God wants to break up our fallow hearts so he can rescue us, grace us with his daily presence, and use us to rescue others.

# Opportunities for Prayer are **Blossoming** at St. Mark Church, our House of Prayer

As Pastor Breum has noted before COVID and now in a post COVID the skies are darkening. For protection we follow the Biblical call to prepare each day by putting on our armor. Why? The devil is always prowling around us. We never know when the devil will attack. He is too shrewd to follow a pattern. Thus, as a wise Christian, one always puts a blanket of anticipation down. How? By prayer and watching and waiting on God, you are ready when he pounces. Now discover who the devil sees when we keep our standing appointment with God each day and put on our armor. From *Daily Growth, Reflections Ministries*. 6/22/2022.



#### Who the Devil Sees<sup>1</sup>

#### (Ephesians 6:10–18)

If any character was the hit of the original *Star Wars* trilogy, it was the evil and infamous Darth Vader. He of the black helmet, black cape, and light saber took the meaning of *armor* to a whole new level. His force-field armor did what all armor does—it protected him and concealed his identity from his opponents. The most shocking moment in the series came when Vader's true identity was revealed. Without his silicon circuits and voice-masking helmet, he was nothing. His armor was his life-support, his essence.

Armor is defensive, first and foremost. But armor also is transformative—it turns a vulnerable mortal into someone different. In fact, when you look at Darth Vader or a medieval knight shod head-to-toe in plate and mail, you are not seeing the real person. Rather, you are seeing what is protecting that person. And armor must be adequate against what is brought against it. While medieval armor could protect against medieval swords, any number of modern weapons could easily pierce such primitive protection.

The armor God gives believers to wear does both things: It changes our identity by covering our weaknesses, and it is totally adequate against the "flaming arrows of the evil one" (Eph. 6:16). Without God's armor, we would be helpless against the devil. He is stronger and craftier than we are, and in our own strength we would be quickly subdued by his attacks. But clothed in truth, righteousness, the gospel of peace, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, and the sword of God's word, we are protected. Our weaknesses are covered with God's strength. We are wearing the same armor that Jesus wore—armor that the devil never penetrated.

When God's armor comes off, we are revealed for who we really are—mice before a roaring lion (1 Peter 5:8). But when we have God's armor on (Eph. 6:11), that roaring lion looks at us and sees Jesus—the Lion of Judah (Rev. 5:5). And that is a fight he wants no part of.

When getting dressed every day, don't fail to put on the armor of God. It is your only sure defense. God's Promise: When you are clothed in God's armor, the devil sees Him, not you.

# WHAT IS A CHURCH MEMBER?

This month we will be looking at the sixth and final chapter: I Will Treasure Membership as a Gift

# The Biblical Perspective:

"Now you are the body of Christ, and individual members of it." 1 Corinthians 12:27 -28

When we repent and place our faith in Jesus we receive the gift of salvation. We then become a member of the body of Christ. That membership is part of the gift of salvation we have received. So membership in the body of Christ is a gift from God. It's not like a country club membership with its entitlements and advantages. And it's not simply a set of obligations.

#### **Universal Church and Local Church:**

The universal church includes all believers everywhere and we are all part of it. The Bible teaches, however, that we must also be part of a local church where we can serve. Most of the New Testament was written about, and to, the local churches.

#### **Understand the Gift:**

Since our church membership is a gift from God, it must be treasured. It should never be taken for granted or taken lightly. We must be deeply thankful for this gift. When we truly appreciate a gift we want to respond to the giver and to the giver's entire family. Those of us in God's family aren't perfect, but our joy in receiving the gifts of salvation and church membership cause us to serve others with joy. We are to put our pride, our grievances and our disappointment in others aside. Jesus taught His disciples that true service to God and others is done in humility. He said, "It must not be like that among you. On the contrary, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first among you must be your slave; just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life—a ransom for many." Matthew 20:26-28. We must always remember how great this gift is, be grateful for our church membership and serve like Jesus did; with humility, gratitude and joy.



# Peace Garden and Columbarium update

The Columbarium committee is working on the final garden design and plans to begin selling niches in the very near future.

As a reminder, the Peace Garden with Columbarium is a gift to the St. Mark congregation from a member family.

A columbarium is an above-ground structure with recesses or niches to receive urns containing human cremation ashes. The St. Mark Columbarium will have 80 niches capable of holding 160 urns. It will be surrounded by paving bricks, landscaping and bench seating, creating the Peace Garden.

Sometimes going back to basics is helpful to ensure everyone in the congregation is informed about events and functions that are necessary for thriving church life. The Annual Meeting that takes place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday each November is



one of those. The Annual Meeting is held between services so it's only an hour long at most and usually shorter. During this meeting, the slate of Council members for the following year is chosen and the spending plan (budget) for the following year is distributed for your approval. Every committee provides a report of all their goals and accomplishments so you can learn about all they've done over the past year. # Ten Prayers God Always Says Yes To





# Feed My Starving Children Events Coming Up!!!

I'd like to bring to your attention a few ways you can be His hands and feet. Besides going on line and signing up to volunteer and pack when *you* are available – we are usually very slow during the summer but we do ask that you sign up in advance – (<u>FMSC Sign Up</u>), there are two events in the future to mark on your calendar.

First, I have already reserved 30 packing slots for Saturday, August 27<sup>th</sup> from 9 to 10:45 for anyone who would like to come pack food with other St. Mark'ians (<u>St. Mark Sign Up</u>). If we had a church bus, I'd say let's all meet at the church and go down together but ...... why don't we meet at the Libertyville site and then decide to meet for an early lunch and/or ice cream after we've packed. As I said, I've reserved 30 slots – I can always make it more!!!

Second, there is a MobilePack event coming up the end of September that sounds AWESOME!! A FMSC MobilePack is where we "take our show on the road" and bring all the packing supplies and food to a specific site and pack there. Usually these are not too close to a permanent site like the sites we have in Libertyville, Aurora, or Schaumburg but this one is in our own back yard. From Thursday September 29<sup>th</sup> through Sunday October 2<sup>nd</sup>, at the NOW Arena in Hoffman Estates (about a 50-minute drive south of St. Mark), Harvest of Hope will be having this event. When you come to one of our permanent sites, you might be packing with maybe 100 people – at this event you will be packing with over 500 people!!!! Their goal for these 4 days is to pack 1 MILLION meals so please sign up and help make this happen!!

Third, through St. Mark's benevolence, we donate funds to FMSC every month but, if the Spirit moves you, you can always donate to FMSC yourself at <u>Ways to Give</u>. For only \$88 you can save a child's life by giving him/her one meal each day for a year. I know that doesn't sound like a lot because we have been so blessed but for a child that has nothing, that one meal gives them hope and a chance to dream!

I would like to introduce all of you to the ALTAR GUILD, especially those of you not familiar with what we do!! Obviously, it has to do with the ALTAR, but exactly what?

We are responsible for the <u>FLOWERS</u> you see and/or purchase weekly. Each week 2 slots are allocated to a member who purchases them for whatever reason they choose. After the services, the blooms can be taken home by those who donated them.

The <u>COMMUNION BREAD</u> we use on the 1st and 3rd Sundays is baked by members. If you might be interested in joining that ministry, contact Linda Pohlman.

The COMMUNION TRAYS are set up and put away by a volunteer. It usually takes less than 1/2 hour to set up the trays, give or take, depending on how many trays are needed, plus setting up the altar elements. To put them away requires clearing the altar and clearing the trays, about 15 minutes of your time. We are looking for a member to reset the communion for the 8am service on the 1st Sunday. In order to get this done, you might need to arrive early, at least 30 minutes before the service starts. It could also be done Saturday night after the 5:30 service.

Another "job" of the Altar Guild is the upkeep of the <u>ALBS</u> worn by the Cantors, communion servers, and acolytes, when they return. They need to be inspected at least monthly. If needed, they should be taken home, washed and ironed. Also any repairs that might be needed should be done. (This usually involves the snaps.)

Any of these services are the perfect opportunity to get involved with the church in the background. These are great for those not having much time or resources to offer. Obviously these are all things that need to be done, but anonymously!!

# PADS Is Returning to St. Mark



One of St. Mark's long time ministries will be returning this fall. PADS was temporarily moved from churches to hotel rooms when Covid hit in 2020. We are very excited to have PADS back and are working on the challenges of getting it up and running again. For those of you who do not know about PADS, here is a brief summary. PADS is an outreach program for the homeless in Lake County. The main office is in Waukegan. It has been around for over 20 years. Homeless people can go to the main office for help finding housing, jobs, healthcare and other issues. The part we help with is overnight shelter. From October 1st through April 30th two churches per night welcome the homeless guests into their buildings. St. Mark does Friday nights. This is a much needed ministry that requires lots of help from the hosting congregations. Below we have outlined what is involved and what we will be asking you for help with.

- 1. Working a shift on Friday night or Saturday morning. The night is divided into three shifts. First shift is from 5:00p to 11:00p. On this shift you would help welcome the guests to the site, serve them dinner, clean up after dinner and then visit with them until they go to sleep. Second shift is from 11:00p to 3:00a. This is the quiet shift and you can quietly visit with the other workers or read a book. Sometimes you may be making the bagged lunches we give to each guest. Third shift is from 3:00a to 7:00a. On this shift you serve breakfast and clean up the kitchen and eating area. We also have set up on Friday night from 5:00p to 6:00p where you would be helping set up, make the sleeping pads and arrange the tables for eating. This is often done by scouting groups as a service project. Clean up is done on Saturday morning starting around 6:00a until done, usually no longer than 8:00a. On this shift you would be bagging all the sheets for taking to the laundry, wiping down all the pads, cleaning the bathrooms, sweeping the floors, moping where needed, and making sure everything is put away. This is a good project for adult groups.
- 2. Being a Site Leader. This is a very important volunteer opportunity. The evening site leader works from 5:00p to 11:00p. They check the guests in, hand out bed assignments, and make sure the evening runs smoothly by answering any questions and helping the guests with any issues. We cannot open the site without site leaders. Ideally we would have four site leaders so you would only work once per month. If you have a gift and love for serving others this would be a great position for you. You can even grab a friend and do this together. The morning site leaders work from about 5:00a until clean up is done. You would help wake the guests, make sure everyone gets on the bus to go back to the PADS office, help with clean up, and make sure the church is back in order.
- 3. Help with donating food. We provide the guests with a hot dinner, a bagged lunch and a breakfast. You would be added to a list of those willing to provide food. You would be called the week before to donate a part of the meals. It can be as simple as dropping off eggs for breakfast or lunch meat or snacks for the lunches, to making a main meal, dessert or veggie dish for dinner. You do not come to the site to cook, you make at home and drop off. You can even order chicken or pizzas and drop it off. We usually have around forty guests but you would not be making for that many people. We have multiple people bringing each part of the meal.

I hope this helps you see exactly what PADS is. If you having any questions or would like to volunteer please call Laurie Kerns at 847-612-1510 or Jill Decker at 847-445-7502. We would be happy to talk to you. More info will be coming in September.

As you can see many hands are needed and we hope you will prayerfully consider being a part of this much needed ministry.



# **How Does the Church Come Up With the Numbers?**

Though the budget is voted on at the Annual Meeting in November, the budgeting process begins in May and takes six months of work to complete! All Committees are provided information about their previous individual budgets in early May and begin to discuss their plans for the next fiscal year. The Committees then provide their requests to the Finance Committee for compilation. The Finance Committee also meets with the Administrator for her input and analyzes the previous year's income and expenses. Once compiled, the budget is sent to the Trustees and Treasurer for review in August. The budget is then

approved by the full Council in September in time for distribution to the Congregation in October. The 2023 budget, approved in November 2022, will guide Council and Committee decisions and programs from January thru December next year!
