From the Desk of Pastor Breum

Dear Friends,

Do you have a lifetime favorite Bible verse? If so, I would like to know what it is. Verses our lives are lived by tells me an awful lot about a person and what is important to him or her. Please either write down on a piece of paper your name and reference or send me an email. Don't worry, I will not say in church, I will not use your name for this is quite personal in nature.

On my phone I receive a verse of the day seven days a week. More often than not the verse of the day speaks in such a way that I think, "This is exactly what I needed to hear. How do they know what verse to pick?"

Here is an example. **Proverbs 24:26 (NLT2)** "26 An honest answer is like a kiss of friendship." A paraphrase puts it like this. **Proverbs 24:26 (MSG)** "26 An honest answer is like a warm hug." My take on this verse. All of us, yes, all of us have rough edges that are not pretty. Actually, they are ugly. We have our personal ways of coping with life, coping with people, protecting ourselves, and more. The sad thing is some of these ways hurt people, turn people off, is highly offensive, and we do not have a clue, we do not know how insensitive we are. I have often heard the phrase, "It is not what you say it is how you say it" and "think before you speak." Someone can speak a word of truth to me and I readily accept it, rounding off a rough edge. Another person can say the very same thing and all I want to do is to tell that person to be quiet and get lost. The difference is actually how it is said. One person means to help. The other person is just mean.

This is where close Christian friendships are so helpful and needed. Speaking the truth in love we can point out the friend's rough edge(s) and help that person grow in the Lord Jesus Christ. Just letting a friend get away with the rough edges is deciding to withhold love. The Bible says, **Proverbs 27:6 (NLT2)** 6 Wounds from a sincere friend are better than many kisses from an enemy.

All of us have room for improvement in our lives, we all do. Letting a friend continually hurt people, make poor choices, allowing their rough edges to scrape people is choosing to withhold Christian love. By speaking the truth in love, addressing the rough edges, you just may be helping their children, their grandchildren, their coworkers from a bunch of needless pain and agony. Pointing out a blind spot may hurt the person for a moment but produce something good for a lifetime.

This is what goes on in my mind when one verse is read. It speaks volumes. The Holy Spirit personalizes God's word. A verse for the day may just be what God ordered for you personally. Thank you to those who have spoken truth to me with love.

MISSOURI MUSINGS

Hidden Miracles

As a seminary professor I get asked to write articles for various projects. A current international study focuses on "the miraculous in the New Testament." I was asked to write on the miraculous, or special divine action, in the letters of John. You will find those letters (1 John, 2 John, and 3 John) just before Jude and Revelation at the end of the Bible.

At first you might think: wait, there are no miracles in those letters! There are no stories of a prophet, Jesus, or an apostle walking on water, casting out demons, feeding multitudes with just a few loaves and fishes, or raising the dead.

But then you might think again. Because actually the apostle John refers to a number of matters that can only be explained by God's special action, or what we rightly call the miraculous.

For example, John writes, "And this is the boldness we have in him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us" (1 John 5:14). How can God in heaven hear your prayer, and act on it, when there are 8 billion people on this planet? But he can and does.

Hearing is the key to fellowship with the Father and Son. John writes: "Let what you *heard* from the beginning abide in you. If what you *heard* from the beginning abides in you, then you will abide in the Son and in the Father" (2:24). A major expression of this fellowship, love, grows out of hearing: "For this is the message you have *heard* from the beginning, that we should love one another" (3:11). As John explains to the congregation he addresses in 2 John, "And this is love, that we walk according to his commandments; this is the commandment just as you have *heard* it from the beginning—you must walk in it" (2 John 6).

God works through his Word, and his Word comes to us by hearing. Hearing is special divine action that transforms those who open their ears and hearts based on Christ's death for us.

Another miracle: John also speaks about being "born of God" (1 John 3:9; 5:18), just like Jesus tells Nicodemus in John 3:3: "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." That's a miracle! But it happens. God takes our lives that have been messed up by a lot of mistakes and neglect and sin. He forgives us and changes our hearts when we repent and believe in Christ.

Another miracle is saving faith. You can have faith in lots of things, but that doesn't mean they will happen. You can have faith that your car will get 100 miles per gallon, or that the Cubs will be playing October baseball in 2022, or that it won't get cold this winter. Good luck with that.

But John writes, "I write these things to you who *believe* in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life" (5:13). God grants to *believing* in Jesus not only a present life that is transformed but also a future life that is unending in his glorious presence. Through Christ believers conquer even death.

This is why John writes, "Everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith" (1 John 5:4).

Generally speaking, believing something just means you have an opinion or hope that something might happen. But through the miracle of faith in Christ, our whole lives and eternal future change.

How about the miracle of the love of God reaching into our lives and through us into others? How about the miracle of abiding in Christ: "God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God" (1 John 4:15)?

How about God's special divine action in Jesus' resurrection, in divine revelation so that we may know God, in atonement for sin through Jesus' shed blood, and in the incarnation--the Son of God taking on a human body (John 1:14). John's letters point to all of these amazing realities!

I saw a book title recently: *Hidden in Plain Sight*. God's Word "hides" the miraculous left and right. Let's not miss it. The same God--Father, Son, and Spirit--continues his work in the world today.

Council Highlights August 2022

Updates were provided by the Co-pastor Call Committee and Columbarium Committee – much good work continues by both and each will inform the congregation as relevant updates are available to share.

Property & Management is coordinating the correction of drainage issues in preparation for the laying of mulch for grounds beautification. Plans also include the installation of gutters along the southwest wall where none currently exist.


Plans are in the works for a Spiritual Gift Workshop and Bible study in late fall. (Interested in helping with this? Contact Debbie Plishka.)

A position description for a PT maintenance role will be prepared for fulfillment Jan 2023. (Interested parties can contact Deb Zuchowski.)

Motion carried to approve items requested by the Memorial Committee on behalf of committees for inclusion on 2023 Memorial Wish List.

Motion carried to amend the current "vetting" process for benevolence recipients; new recipients will be vetted annually for 3 years and after 3 years, the vetting schedule will reduce to once each 3 years pending ongoing satisfactory financial records.

One Bylaw revision was approved for presentation to the congregation during the upcoming Annual Meeting. The 2023 Council nomination process will remain open through the first week of October, after which time names and biographies of candidates will be provided to the congregation on October 16, 4 weeks prior to the Annual Meeting on November 13. To date, a candidate has been identified and has accepted nomination for each position (Trustee pending).



Your Abundance Determines Your Possibilities

The Annual Meeting is approaching quickly. The Proposed 2023 Budget will be available in the Narthex for your review prior to the meeting. The Budget reflects what we expect in giving as well as expenses. In the past 10 years God has provided all that St. Mark has needed financially. In fact, He has provided abundantly. St. Mark currently has approximately \$195,000 in unrestricted funds (checking and savings) as well as \$60,000 in a Contingency Fund. Kent Hunter, from Church Doctor Ministries and author of *Discover Your Windows*, questions, "What if Jesus were to come back and visit a church that had a surplus of funds in their account? What if

outreach ministries were suffering because the leaders felt it would be wiser to place money in 'reserve' funds? What would he say?" The Finance Committee fully supports Council's decision to look toward, and plan for, the future using the **abundance** God has already provided for His use.

Opportunities for Prayer are Flourishing at St. Mark Church, our House of Prayer

"You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.

This is the first and greatest commandment." Mark 22: 37-38

Do we? To be honest, it is an everyday struggle. So what is a Christian to do? A.W. Tozer in his book. <u>Prayer, Communing with God in Everything</u>, writes a Christian needs to realize one must renew the mind 24/7 to conform to the image of God and "practice living to the glory of God, actually and determinedly" ¹ in all we do.

The first step is to ask yourself, "Am I trying to do the impossible - living in two worlds - the secular (the world and the flesh) and the sacred at the same time?" As a new being in Christ, one cannot continue to walk in shoes of the old Adam. C.S. Lewis provides an



insightful description of this battle between the natural self and the new self in Christ. See Mere Christianity, Book 4, Chapter 8 "Is Christianity Hard or Easy?" Click on this link to view an awesome graphic rendering of the written words. About 16 minutes. https://youtu.be/lzJJ23MmOGU

It is one thing to see this truth, but it is not enough. Tozer writes, "If we would escape from the toils of the sacred - secular dilemma, the truth must run in our blood." "...success in this struggle ...is possible only by the exercise of an aggressive faith. ...offer all our acts (24/7) to God and believe He accepts them. Then hold firmly to that position.... Keep reminding God in times of private prayer that we mean every act for His glory; then supplement those times by a thousand thought prayers as we go about the job of living in a secular culture.

In short, Tozer points to four steps to success in this sacred-secular dilemma: 1) aggressive faith in God, 2) surrender of all our acts to Him, 3) private prayer and 4) thousands of thought-prayers.³ Thus, our new self with the help of the Holy Spirit is enabled to lift up every choice and act up into a living kingdom and turn the whole life into a sacrament.² Let us practice the fine art of making every work a priestly ministration."³

To cut to the chase, to not leave you in suspense until next month's VOICE, and to not put words in your mouth because $-\underline{of}$ \underline{course} – you knew all these answers already

Yes – St. Mark does have a First Response Team. It consists of members from both Sunday services who have, through ongoing continuing education with CPR and first aid training, stepped up to help in case of any kind of need. If you would like to be on this team, especially anyone that regularly attends the Saturday night service, please contact a Safety and Security Committee member listed on page 12.

Yes – Your Sunday School kids did an awesome job this past Spring on both drills!!! The Safety and Security Committee also meets with Sunday School teachers annually to direct them on what to do in case of an emergency.

Yes — We probably will have another drill this Fall, coordinated with the Lake Villa Fire Department. We again will probably tell you when the drill will occur but just a couple of reminders from last year's drill that we need to work on. One, once we exit the building, we will need to be standing/gathering farther away from the building to allow emergency vehicles access to the building. And two, related to allowing vehicles access to the building, we should not get into our cars and try to leave. This could hinder emergency vehicles just getting into our parking lot. We know it is only a drill, but we do want to be ready if, and pray to God it doesn't happen, a real emergency should occur during church.

President's Message Continued from page 1

The Book of Revelation addresses seven letters to seven churches in Asia Minor (modern-day Turkey) (Revelation 2-3). Each letter, as proclaimed by Jesus and recorded by John the Apostle, declares the triumphs and failings of the recipient churches and warns each congregation to repent. The advice in these letters is prophetic, forewarning present-day Christian communities of the snares that can lure us away from our faith.



The lesson in the letter to *Ephesus* teaches that truth and love must go hand-in-hand. A church that upholds doctrinal purity at the expense of showing love is just as flawed as a church that upholds congregational harmony at the expense of truthful teachings. Instead, Jesus reveals that a church fashioned in His image must teach God's Truth in love.

Like the church of *Smyrna*, Christians are persecuted worldwide in obvious and insidious ways. This letter warns all Christians that although we may suffer greatly, the length of **tribulation** will be short compared to the promise of eternal life.

Like the Christians in *Pergamum*, it's easy to normalize the non-Christian behavior of those around us and allow that behavior to dilute our values (1 Corinthians 15:33). But the Bible urges us to "not conform to the pattern of this world" but be

transformed by the renewal of our mind in accordance with God's Word (Romans 12:2).

Just as some in the church of *Thyatira* were led astray by a false prophet, Christians today fall prey to cult leaders, occult practices, and other false teachings. To share in Christ's victory, we are to avoid these "so-called deep secrets" of Satan (Revelation 2:24) and hold firm to Christ's teachings.

Today, Christians can fall into the trap that ensnared the church in *Sardis* if we merely go through the motions of practicing our faith without really feeding our spirit. We can avoid becoming "the living dead" by engaging in our faith through Bible study, prayer, and fellowship.

The message to *Philadelphia* shows us the blessings that come when we maintain our faith despite life's tribulations. In fact, those who persevere despite weaknesses will stand strong as pillars in Heaven.

Like the church of *Laodicea*, it's easy to become complacent in our faith during times of abundance. Christ warns us in this revelation that he will "spit out" lukewarm disciples. Instead, Jesus urges us to keep seeking the Lord's face even after His hand has bestowed riches in our lives.

My prayer is that we will continue to seek God's face in all we do, that our faith and knowledge will continue to grow through Bible studies and prayer, that we will spend real time with Jesus to know Him, not just know about Him. I believe we are growing spiritually as a congregation and I pray this continues so others see "this little light of ours that we're gonna let shine" all over Lindenhurst and the surrounding communities – they are our mission field.

Your Abilities Are God's Map for Your Life By Rick Warren

"May he equip you with all you need for doing his will. May he produce in you, through the power of Jesus Christ, every good thing that is pleasing to him." Hebrews 13:21 (NLT)

Once upon a time, some animals wanted to start a school. They decided the courses would include running, climbing, swimming, and flying. Then they decided that *all* of the animals should take *all* of the courses. That's where the problem started.

The duck was better than his teacher at swimming, but he only made passing grades in flying and was very poor in running. So, they made him drop swimming and stay after school to practice running. This caused his webbed feet to be badly worn, and his grade dropped to average in swimming. But everybody felt less threatened and more comfortable with that - except the duck.

The rabbit started at the top of his class in running, but because of so much makeup work in swimming, he caught pneumonia and had to drop out of school.

The squirrel showed outstanding ability in climbing, but he was extremely frustrated in flying class because the teacher insisted that he start from the ground up rather than the treetop down. He developed charley horses from overextension, so he only got a "C" in climbing and a "D" in running.

The eagle was the problem student and was disciplined for being a nonconformist. For instance, in climbing class he beat all the others to the top of the tree, but he insisted on flying to get there. Finally, because he refused to participate in swimming class, he was expelled.

As you might imagine, the animals' school didn't work.

Different animals are designed to excel in specific areas, and they can't be expected to do all the other things. A duck is made to be a duck—not anything else.

It's the same for people. God has designed each person different from all the others. When you expect everyone to fit in the same mold, the result is frustration, discouragement, mediocrity, and failure.

God made you to be you. He has given you unique abilities, and he wants you to use them the way he intended.

Are you wondering what God's will is for your life? Look at your abilities. They're your road map; they point you in the direction you should go. When you know what you're good at, then you can know what God wants you to do with your life.

The Bible says, "May he equip you with all you need for doing his will. May he produce in you, through the power of Jesus Christ, every good thing that is pleasing to him" (Hebrews 13:21 NLT).

Through your abilities, God has equipped you to do his will. As you use those abilities, you'll start to see how he produces "every good thing" in your life.


