- Create or assist church committees with proposed written policies, procedures and guidelines for the various practices.
- Evaluate practices to determine if improvements can be made;
- Evaluate practices for compliance with St. Mark Constitution and By-Laws and society's legal, moral and ethical standards;
- Assemble Council-approved policies and procedures into a common "Policies and Guidelines Manual";
- Make the "Policies and Guidelines Manual" known and available to Council and committee members as a reference document so that there is a consistency in practices year after year, even as Council and committee membership changes.

Jerry Doran, Mell Ellingsen, Bill Ersbo and Jim O'Neal met in Mid-2019 to put structure around an earlier \$25,000 gift to St. Mark designated for youth programs. The donor wanted to preserve the principle and gift the earnings. Today, the Endowment Fund has a market value over \$75,000 and has both a General Fund and Youth (Butterfly) Fund as a special resource for future income and stability for St. Mark. The funds are invested with Thrivent Charitable Impact and Investing.

The Endowment Fund is ready to accept direct monetary donations via the offering plate and the St. Mark electronic giving tools as well as anonymous donations. It is understood that special gifts and bequests should not take the place of faithful stewardship of current income, but should be made to enable the Church to continue and extend its mission in the future, both here and abroad. The gifts to the Endowment Fund may include bequests in wills, charitable remainder trusts, transfers of real property, life income gifts, assignments of life insurance and special or memorial gifts. Such gifts are encouraged and shall be used with care and sensitivity.
